

Resumption of Millionaire Party Events Minimum Requirements

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified (charitable) organizations must meet the following minimum requirements to resume operations. Some of these requirements may necessitate coordination between the qualified organization and its millionaire party supplier, and the location owner.

In addition to these minimum requirements, licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified organizations must comply with all applicable local, state, and federal statutes, rules, orders, guidelines, and standards. This includes, but is not limited to, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Order under MCL 333.2253 – Gatherings and Face Mask Order issued January 13, 2021, https://www.michigan.gov/coronavirus/0,9753,7-406-98178_98455-549437--,00.html. COVID-19 Preparedness and Response Plan

Each millionaire party supplier must develop a COVID-19 preparedness and response plan. A copy of the plan must be submitted to the Executive Director at least seven days prior to resuming in-person operations. Each qualified organization must submit, with its millionaire party event application:

- If using a licensed millionaire party supplier, a copy of the supplier's COVID-19 preparedness and response plan, or
- If not using a licensed millionaire party supplier, a written preparedness and response plan for the millionaire party event explaining how the qualified organization will comply with all requirements.

Employee/Contractor Training

Prior to resuming in-person activities, millionaire party supplier employees, agents, and contractors must receive COVID-19 training that covers, at a minimum:

- 1) Workplace infection-control practices.
- 2) The proper use of personal protective equipment.
- 3) Steps the employee, agent, or contractor must take to notify the business or operation of any symptoms of COVID-19 or a suspected or confirmed diagnosis of COVID-19.
- 4) How to report unsafe working conditions.

Social Distancing

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified organizations must comply with the all gathering and capacity limitations set forth Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Order Under MCL 333.2253 – Gatherings and Face Mask Order issued January 13, 2021, https://www.michigan.gov/coronavirus/0,9753,7-406-98178_98455-549437--,00.html. This includes but is not limited to: (1) not having household groups consisting of more than six persons; and (2) having households spaced or seated at least 6 feet apart. This means that up to six members of the same household may share a table; tables must be spaced at least six feet apart; and members of different households must not be seated together unless there is at least six feet between each person.

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified organizations must provide physical guides, such as tape on floors or sidewalks and signage on walls to ensure that patrons remain at least six feet apart in any lines. If possible, designate entry and exit points with signage of the directional flow of patrons to ensure proper social distancing.

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified organizations must require six feet of separation between parties or groups at each table and between different tables (e.g., spread seats out, spread tables out, use every other table, remove or put-up chairs or barstools that are not in use).

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified organizations must ensure patrons do not congregate in groups around gaming tables.

Face Masks

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified organizations must require all employees, agents, contractors, charity members and patrons to wear face masks at all times during a licensed millionaire party event, except as provided for in the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Order Under MCL 333.2253 – Gatherings and Face Mask Order issued January 13, 2021, https://www.michigan.gov/coronavirus/0,9753,7-406-98178_98455-549437--,00.html.

Signage

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and/or qualified organizations must post sign(s) at entrance(s) into the demarcated gaming area informing patrons not to enter if they are or have recently been sick.

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and/or qualified organizations must post sign(s) instructing patrons to wear face masks.

Food & Beverage

There must be no food or beverages sold or consumed on the premises.

Screening Protocols

Millionaire party suppliers must conduct a daily entry self-screening protocol for all employees, agents, and contractors entering the workplace, including, at a minimum, a questionnaire covering symptoms and suspected or confirmed exposure to people with possible COVID-19.

Cleaning/Disinfecting

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified organizations must ensure regular cleaning and disinfecting occurs to limit exposure to COVID-19, especially on high-touch surfaces (e.g., door handles, counters, restrooms, table rails, trash bins, light switches, time clocks, etc.).

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified organizations must ensure protocols are in place to thoroughly clean and disinfect the millionaire party event location in the event of a positive COVID-19 case.

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified organizations must only use proven cleaning products in accordance with EPA guidelines for coronaviruses, bacteria, and other infectious pathogens.

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified organizations must make cleaning supplies available to employees, agents, contractors, and charity members.

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and qualified organizations must provide time for employees, agents, contractors, and charity members to wash hands frequently or to use hand sanitizer.

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and/or qualified organizations must disinfect or replace playing cards touched by patrons before each day of a millionaire party event.

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and/or qualified organizations must disinfect gaming chips touched by patrons before each day of a millionaire party event.

Case Monitoring

Licensed millionaire party suppliers and/or qualified organizations must establish a response plan for dealing with a confirmed infection at a location where a millionaire

party is conducted, including protocols for sending employees, agents, contractors and charity members home, and for temporary closures of all or part of the workplace to allow for thorough cleaning and disinfecting.

When an employee, agent, contractor, charity member, or patron is identified with a confirmed case of COVID-19, a millionaire party supplier must comply with applicable State rules and orders, as well as immediately notify the Executive Director of the Michigan Gaming Control Board.
