DIRECTIVE EXTENDING CANCELLATION OF MILLIONAIRE PARTIES

On March 10, 2020, Governor Whitmer issued Executive Order 2020-4. The order declared a state of emergency across the State of Michigan under section 1 of article 5 of the Michigan Constitution of 1963, the Emergency Management Act, 1976 PA 390, as amended, MCL 30.401-30.421, and the Emergency Powers of the Governor Act of 1945, 1945 PA 302, as amended, MCL 10.31-10.33.

On March 16, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-09. Pursuant to that Executive Order, places of public accommodations and public amusement were ordered closed to ingress, egress, use, and occupancy by members of the public. The order specifically included millionaire parties. On March 22, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-20 which extended the closure until April 13, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. and rescinded Executive Order 2020-09. On April 13, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-43 extending the cancellation of millionaire parties until April 30, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. and rescinding Executive Order 2020-20. On April 24, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-59 suspending activities that are not necessary to sustain or protect life through May 15, 2020. It is, therefore, necessary to extend the cancellation of all millionaire party events until further notice.

Millionaire party licensees and anyone with a pending application for a millionaire party license may make a written request for a refund or submit an event change request. Please be advised, no event change requests or applications for new millionaire party events for this time period will be issued. As government operations permit, applications for millionaire party event dates after May 15, 2020, will continue to be processed. At this time, licensed millionaire party events scheduled after May 15, 2020, are not cancelled but may be subject to change pursuant to further directive or order.
