Over a decade ago the Michigan Iron Industry Museum launched a capital campaign to become a year-round facility, a stronger educational resource, and a tourist hub. Thanks to grants and the support of the community, the museum added a new wing, a store, a road with direct access to US 41, comfortable auditorium seating, and two interpretive trails that connect to the Iron Ore Heritage Trail Network.


