

Asset Management Readiness Assessment Scale

The Michigan Infrastructure Council (MIC) Asset Management Readiness Assessment Scale (“The Scale”) is intended to help infrastructure owners **understand, measure, and advance** their asset management proficiency. The Scale provides a simple to use, common methodology that can be applied across transportation, water, utilities, and communications assets to produce quantifiable results, allowing users to develop improvement goals and systematically reassess their progress.

The Scale measures progress across five asset management competencies — People and Leadership; Data and Information; Planning and Prioritization; Policy and Governance; and External Communication and Knowledge Sharing. Together, these five competencies are key for sustainable service delivery.
