**Executive Director Report** 

Jessica Moy, MIC Executive Director

- Jessica thanked those who have participated in the Regional Asset Management Summits over the last 3 weeks. The summits have exceeded expectations and have produced significant feedback from the attendees. Several "Summit highlights" were shared by MIC and Council members. MIC staff will be compiling the feedback and issuing a brief report in July. This report and data will be available on the MIC website and included in the September 30 Year-End Report.
- The work on the Asset Management Readiness subgroup continues. There is currently an open RFP for vendor services with review and award expected by the end of the month.
- Participants of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Infrastructure Commission and the Asset Management Pilot will receive a survey on July 2 the one-year anniversary of the MIC legislation. The survey will capture feedback from these 2016-2018 activities, per legislative requirements.

- The layout of the Annual Report is underway. A draft is expected to be completed by mid to late August. The Reports subgroup will be reconvened at that time.
- The Project Portal Subgroup is working toward a demonstration portal by fall in time for the fall Summits. Reminder: this is a project portal, not a data portal intended to identify opportunities for collaboration at the project level. No asset data will be collected.

#### Transportation Asset Management Council (TAMC) Report

Joanna Johnson, TAMC Chairperson

- The TAMC Spring Conference was held in May. It was an overall success. Various awards for asset management were presented. Details can be found on the TAMC website.
- The TAMC held a strategic planning session on June 5. It identified upcoming TAMC tasks and activities.
- The TAMC will be presenting at the WAMC meeting on June 27.
- TAMC is continuing its work to draft and finalize the transportation asset management plan template.

#### Water Asset Management Council (WAMC) Report

• WAMC is continuing its work on the water asset management plan template. The focus is a simple and easy to complete template, capture of linear assets in the right-of-way, a common understanding among those completing the templates, and a simplified process for submitting.

- The electric vehicle charging pilot program has rolled out.
- Consumers Energy's integrated resource plan has been approved.
- MPSC will assist in getting utility leadership to the table in order to begin coordination efforts with DNR and MDOT regarding the electric vehicle charging stations.

Ken McFarlane, chair of the Asset Management Readiness Subgroup gave an update on the group's status. The subgroup is on track to conduct their statewide survey in the fall and will actively engage with the selected vendor after award.

### Palencia Mobley, 39



Deputy Director and Chief Engineer, Detroit Water and Sewerage Department

She may be a self-professed "girly girl" who loves to shop (she recently modeled for a plus-size clothing company's body-positive campaign), but what Palencia Mobley really loves thinking about is toilets. And sewer lines. And tap water. And, of course, her favorite subject, "asset management" of the entire system of water infrastructure she's responsible for as deputy director and chief engineer at Detroit Water and Sewerage Department, a post she has held since 2016.

After completing degrees in chemical engineering from the University of Michigan and civil engineering from Wayne State University, Mobley worked in consulting before joining the mayor's transition team in 2014. Moving to the public sector was a way to satisfy her desire to help people; she had long thought about going into teaching. And as a proud lifelong Detroiter, Mobley believes she is uniquely positioned to connect with residents.


"Being a Detroiter allows me the ability to relate to our customers," she said. "Even though I have a technical background, I'm able to explain things in colloquial terms they can understand."

Mobley believes her signature accomplishment has been her leadership in negotiating the establishment of the Great Lakes Water Authority, which was a critical piece of the city's bankruptcy exit. She's also pushed hard on reinvesting in the city's infrastructure. During her tenure, DWSD has tripled the length of sewer piping it upgrades annually, from 10-15 miles of upgrades in 2016 to over 47 miles in 2018. Next up is making Detroit the greenest city in America by converting its vast reserves of publicly owned land into green infrastructure to manage stormwater.

While some may think of water and sewer infrastructure as mundane, Mobley marvels at it.

"We just assume that when you put on the tap, clean water is going to come out and, when you flush the toilet, waste will leave your house and never come back," Mobley said. "We don't really understand how it works. For me, it's about making that connection."

*Background:* The management of Michigan's transportation, water, utilities, and communications assets has become increasingly urgent as our state's vital infrastructure is aging and deteriorating. Your participation in the Regional Asset Management summits gives YOU an opportunity to share your perspective, offer ideas, and voice concerns on this important topic.

- 2016: The 21<sup>st</sup> Century Infrastructure Commission was formed to initiate planning, development, and management of Michigan's complex infrastructure systems over the next 30 to 50 years. Through the publication of a comprehensive report (2016), the Commission emphasized that successful infrastructure asset management should leverage a well-documented, standardized, and collaborative approach.
- 2017: A regional Infrastructure Asset Management Pilot was conducted across 16 west Michigan and southeast Michigan counties to evaluate data availability and collection methods, develop processes that could be leveraged statewide, and initiate coordination activities across infrastructure sectors.
- 2018: Three councils were created and/or reconfigured to collaboratively guide Michigan's public and private utility and infrastructure owners, regional representatives, finance and policy experts, and state department leaders toward a 30-year management plan for Michigan's diverse infrastructure network.
  - The Michigan Infrastructure Council established through Public Act 323 of 2018
  - The Water Asset Management Council established through Public Act 324 of 2018
  - The Transportation Asset Management Council received a broadened scope and realignment through Public Act 325 of 2018
- 2019: **We need your input!** The Michigan Infrastructure Council will be working with regions across the state to host spring and fall regional Communication and Collaboration Summits. These summits are an opportunity to engage with your peers, contribute ideas and voice concerns from your unique perspective, and help drive the future of integrated, Infrastructure Asset Management in Michigan.
- 2021: Publication of Michigan's 30-year Integrated Infrastructure Strategy
