LEASE FOR STATE OWNED PROPERTY

- DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE, SAINT IGNACE – Renewal of Lease #10004 effective October 1, 2013, through September 30, 2023, with the Mackinac Bridge Authority, a State of Michigan government entity, with offices at N415 I-75, Saint Ignace, Michigan 49781, as Lessor and the State of Michigan by the Department of Technology, Management and Budget for the Department of State Police as Lessee, for the buildings and grounds constituting the Michigan State Police Post located at N430 I-75, Saint Ignace, Michigan 49781. Effective October 1, 2013, the annual rental rate for this Lease is \$33,600.00 (\$2,800.00 per month). Effective October 1, 2018, the annual rental rate for this lease is \$43,200.00 (\$3,600.00) per month. This Lease contains a Standard Cancellation clause with 180 days' notice by Lessee. The Attorney General has approved this Lease as to legal form.

Purpose/Business Case:

This Lease provides buildings and grounds which are suitable for use as a Michigan State Police Post.

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Benefit:

This Lease allows the Michigan State Police to enjoy a strategically sited police post with immediate access to the Mackinac Bridge and the counties nearby on either side while also allowing the Mackinac Bridge Authority to have additional critical security and emergency management resources close at hand.

Funding Source:

100% General Funds

Commitment Level:

Ten years; however, this Lease contains a Legislative Cancellation clause with 180 days' notice.

Risk Assessment:

This site is uniquely advantageous to both the Michigan State Police Department and the Mackinac Bridge Authority as a State Police Post. Not having a State Police Post there would likely tend to reduce security for the bridge itself and impede State Police response times in parts of nearby counties.

ADDENDUM TO LEASE FOR PRIVATE PROPERTY

8. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, STANTON – Addendum #1 to Lease #10122 with DeShano Construction Company, whose address is 325 Commerce Court, Gladwin, MI 48624, as Lessor, and the State of Michigan by the Department of Technology, Management and Budget, for the Department of Human Services, as Lessee, for 15,450 square feet of office space located at 619 N. State Street, Stanton, MI 48888. This Addendum exercises the first renewal option for a lower square foot rate; provides for new flooring in the office and lobby, plus minor renovations; and adds a third renewal option period. This Addendum is effective upon obtaining State Administrative Board approval and required signatures and continues to the termination date of August 31, 2020, or any extension. The current per square foot rental rate is \$12.83 (\$16,520.00 per month). Effective August 28, 2015, the annual per square foot rental rate for this space, decreases to \$4.50 (\$5,793.75 per month). This Addendum contains two 5-year renewal options with an annual per square foot rental rate of \$5.00 (\$6,437.50 per month) and \$6.21 (\$8,000.00 per month) respectively. This Lease contains an Executive cancellation clause with 60 days' notice until August 27, 2015. The renewal options have a Standard cancellation clause requiring 90 days' notice. The Attorney General has approved this Addendum as to legal form.

Purpose/Business Case:

The purpose of this Addendum is to continue to provide the Department of Human Services with an office location that fulfills their client and operational needs in Montcalm County.

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Benefit:

The extension of the Lease allows the Department to remain at its current location and obtain a rental rate reduction for the renewal option that is being exercised, plus the benefit of new flooring and improvements. The rental rate is within the current market rate for comparable space.

Funding Source:

55% General Funds

45% Federal Funds

Commitment Level:

Six years with two 5-year renewal option periods; however, this Lease contains an Executive cancellation clause with 60 days' notice for the next 17 months, then a Standard cancellation clause with 90 days' notice for the renewal option periods.

Risk Assessment:

Non-approval of this Addendum will hinder the Department from continuing to provide uninterrupted service and realize a rental savings. If required to relocate, the Department may incur increased costs.

ADDENDUM TO SUB-LEASE FOR PRIVATE PROPERTY

9. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, HOLLAND - Addendum #2 to Sub-Lease #11112 approved by the State Administrative Board on May 3, 2005, between The Huntington National Bank, 37 West Broad Street, Suite 1000, Columbus, OH 43215, as Sub-Lessor, and the State of Michigan by the Department of Technology, Management and Budget for the Department of Labor and Economic Growth, renamed the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs and subsequently assigned to the Department of Human Services, as Sub-Lessee, for 4,297 square feet of space located at 119 Clover Avenue, Holland, MI 49423. This Addendum provides for a reduction in the leased square footage from 4,297 to a new total of 3,951. This Addendum is effective upon obtaining State Administrative Board approval and required signatures and continues to the termination date of November 30, 2015, or any extension. The annual per square foot rental rate for this space beginning December 1, 2010, was \$9.48 (\$3,398.21 per month). The annual per square foot rental rate for this space beginning September 1, 2013 is \$9.48 (\$3,121.29 per month). This Sub-Lease contains a Standard cancellation clause with 90 days' notice. The Attorney General has approved this Addendum as to legal form.

Purpose/Business Case:

The purpose of this Addendum is to reduce the square footage and the rental rate effective September 1, 2013.

Benefit:

The Department is only paying for square footage that they occupy and use.

One year and eight months; however, this Sub-lease contains a Standard cancellation clause with 90 days' notice.

GRANT OF EASEMENT AMENDMENT

10. Granting of this Easement Amendment will allow the State to better manage its assets and to finalize the original anticipated Easement area granted prior to approvals of Northville Township. 

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT), International Bridge Administration (IBA), Superior Region, has completed the pre-construction services phase of Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC) services for the redevelopment of the International Bridge Plaza.

MDOT/IBA staff, with the assistance of a design consultant, have prepared construction plans. Work includes the reconstruction of I-75 Exit 394 ramps (NB on and SB off), toll booths, administration building, parking areas, watermain, storm and sanitary sewer, utility systems, exterior lighting, landscaping, signing, striping, and the replacement/resurfacing of the I-75 concrete approach from the toll booths to the south bridge abutment. The project is necessary to replace the toll plaza's functionally obsolete 52 year-old administration building and toll booths, alleviate difficult transport-turning-radii from the new U.S. Customs and Border Protection facility immediately contiguous, and provide a more efficient crossing to bridge customers.

Price negotiations with the Contractor commenced on April 1, 2014, following an initial price submittal of \$10,074,729, and concluded on May 9, 2014, with a final Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) of \$8,627,282, an overall reduction of 16.8%. In addition, the Contractor's GMP was 7.4% above an Independent Cost Estimate GMP of \$8,034,578, which was performed as a component of the innovative CMGC bid method. There is \$271,294 in adjustable work items in the Contractor's proposal.

IBA is using the CMGC method for this project to benefit the public and project by providing value engineering, cost control, an expedited schedule, and resolution of the complex staging requirements due to the type of work and toll corridor.

The anticipated start date for construction is on or about May 27, 2014. The project will be funded with IBA toll revenue. This project includes a five year material and workmanship pavement warranty and 0.00 % DBE participation is required.

In accordance with MDOT's policies and procedures and subject to concurrence by the Federal Highway Administration, the preparation and award of the appropriate documents approved by the Attorney General, and compliance with all legal and fiscal requirements, the Director recommends for approval by the State Administrative Board the items on this agenda.

The approval by the State Administrative Board of these contracts does not constitute the award of same. The award of contracts shall be made at the discretion of the Director-Department of Transportation when the aforementioned requirements have been met. Subject to exercise of that discretion, I approve the contracts described in this agenda and authorize their award by the responsible management staff of MDOT to the extent authorized by, and in accordance with, the December 14, 1983, resolution of the State Transportation Commission and the Director's delegation memorandum of October 7, 2013.


