

#### **Description and Justification**

The purpose of this contract is to perform roof repairs and apply fluid membrane waterproof coatings to the existing standing seam metal roofs at ten buildings located on the south side of the facility complex. The buildings have been assessed as requiring urgent repair, with water infiltration issues developing.

The existing air handling units and other major HVAC equipment have failed and are no longer functional or repairable; the facility was served by only secondary heat from perimeter radiation during 2014 winter and required temporary supplemental heat to maintain operational conditions for occupants. This renovation will provide new systems, equipment and controls, designed and installed to provide appropriate environmental control, reduce operating costs and extend the service life of the facilities.

Through a process managed by the CSM Group as part of the services of their contract, multiple construction trade bid packages for tenant fit-up work have been designed, competitively bid, assessed and are being recommended for approval. These trade packages include suspended ceiling systems for all tenant areas, metal stud and dry wall for offices, conference rooms and break rooms, finish painting, doors and hardware, vinyl floor tile, metal fabrications, extending plumbing systems to break areas, extending HVAC systems from main plenums to tenant areas, final fire protection distribution from main risers to tenant areas, electrical power distribution from main electrical panels to tenant areas, and all lighting for tenant areas. The scope of this tenant fit-up work incorporates floor areas from the basement to the 8th floor as well as the roof mechanical penthouse. Previously approved CCO 3 incorporated the major building infrastructure upgrades into the contract whereas this CCO 5 provides the terminations to those building infrastructure systems as well as incorporating building finishes to tenant areas. This modification will also incorporate engineering work involving the assessment of alternative energy distribution systems, electrical sub metering and minor improvements to the existing 1st floor concessions area. The discovery of additional asbestos material in wall cavity areas previously inaccessible has extended the asbestos abatement process that will extend the construction contract duration by 30 days, the cost of which is included in this modification. The revised construction completion date is April 24, 2015.

The purpose of this change order is to redesign and replace the buildings perimeter hot water heating system. The original contract scope of work only included adding zoning and controls to the perimeter heat system as part of the underfloor HVAC system replacement. Further investigation of the existing site conditions during demolition revealed that the existing perimeter heating is inadequate; the system had less than 20% of the required fin tube with no zoning and two long continuous loops. 



1. – 166.HIGHWAYS (Maintenance) - State Trunkline Maintenance

Contracts between MDOT and the following municipalities will provide for statewide trunkline maintenance for a five-year period. The contracts will be in effect from October 1, 2014, through September 30, 2019.

Public Act (PA) 17 of 1925 authorizes MDOT to contract with cities, villages, and boards of county road commissioners for the construction, improvement, and maintenance of state trunkline highways. Under the terms of the standard maintenance contracts, the cities, villages, and boards are reimbursed for audited labor, equipment rental, and material charges in accordance with the provisions of the contracts. These maintenance contracts were not competitively bid but were negotiated with the local units of government. MDOT has made findings that such negotiated contracts are in the public interest and has transmitted those findings in accordance with Section 11c of 1951 PA 51, MCL 247.66a(c).

These contracts are on a cost reimbursement basis, subject to final audit to actual costs. Billings are submitted by the municipalities on a quarterly basis to be approved by the Regions. Actual work is planned by the Regions in cooperation with the municipalities. In general, the total amounts for the maintenance budgets are based on legislative appropriations; the Regions establish and administer the individual municipal budgets. Source of Funds: 100% State Restricted Trunkline Funds.



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


