ADDENDUM TO LEASE FOR PRIVATE PROPERTY

6. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS, JACKSON - Addendum No. 2 to Lease No. 11221 approved by the State Administrative Board on July 3, 2007, between the County of Jackson, whose address is 120 W. Michigan Avenue, Jackson, MI 49201, as Lessor, and the State of Michigan by the Department of Technology, Management & Budget for the Department of Corrections, as Lessee, for 6,373 square feet of office space located at 1697 Lansing Avenue, Jackson, MI 49202. This Addendum provides for establishing a rent rate for the two renewal options, while combining both into one 10-year option and exercising the renewal option. This Addendum is effective upon obtaining State Administrative Board approval and required signatures and continues to the termination date of the Addendum

or any extension. The annual per square foot rental rate for this space beginning May 1, 2017, is \$8.50 (\$4,514.21 per month). Effective May 1, 2022, the annual per square foot rental rate for this space increases to \$9.35 (\$4,965.63 per month). This Lease contains a Standard cancellation clause with 90-days' notice. The Attorney General has approved this Addendum as to legal form.

Purpose/Business Case:

The purpose of this Addendum is to extend the Lease for 10 years at the current rate for the next five years, at which time a mid-term increase begins. The current parole office location meets the operational needs of the Department and provides sufficient customer access and conveniences.

Benefit:

The new 10-year term will provide DOC with no rate increase for the first five years of this time period. The rental rate is within current market rates.

GRANT OF EASEMENT

7. DEPARTMENT OF TECHNOLOGY, MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET (DTMB) FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS (DOC), CITY OF LAPEER, COUNTY OF LAPEER: A recommendation and request that the State Administrative Board grant to Michigan Bell Telephone Company, d.b.a. AT&T Michigan, a Michigan corporation, whose address is 444 Michigan Avenue, Detroit, Michigan, 48226, a permanent non-exclusive easement for installing, maintaining and operating a buried telecommunication line to exclusively serve the Thumb Correctional Facility under the jurisdiction of the DOC and located at 3225 John Conley Drive, Lapeer, Michigan 48446. The easement is sited on part of the Southeast 1/4 of Section 12, T7N-R9E, City of Lapeer, County of Lapeer, Michigan, and is more particularly described as:

A 10 foot wide easement for underground communication line lying 5 foot either side of the following described centerline: Commencing at the Center 1/4 Corner of Section 12, Town 7 North, Range 9 East, City of Lapeer, Lapeer County, Michigan; thence S01°51'45"E, along the North and South 1/4 line of said section, 314.28 feet to the south right of way line of John Conley Drive; thence, along the southerly right of way of said drive, along a 27.62 foot curve to the left, with a radius of 993.00 feet and a chord bearing and distance of N36°15'49"E 27.62 feet to the point of beginning of this easement description being the centerline of a 10 foot

wide easement for underground communication line; thence S89°17'10"E 429.68', more or less to the westerly wall of the Thumb Correctional Facility Administration building and the point of ending. The sidelines of this easement shall be lengthened or foreshortened to intersect the said road right-of-way and said building wall. The easement area contains 0.10 acres of land, more or less and would be granted subject to all agreements, covenants, easements, right-of-ways, reservations and restrictions of record, if any.

The Office of the Attorney General has approved this easement agreement as to legal form.

Purpose:

This easement will accommodate the installation of a new buried telecommunications line dedicated to serving the DOC Thumb Correctional Facility. Benefit:

This telecommunications line accommodated by this easement will enable DOC to provide tablet-delivered education and programming content to targeted prison populations at the Thumb Correctional Facility.

The old pneumatic controls systems within these buildings have failed and a number of the heating coils within the air handling systems are at a condition where they can no longer be repaired and must be replaced. This project is considered by the Department of Corrections to be of very high priority as they have had difficulty maintaining consistent heat levels in these various facilities for prisoner housing and for the provision of various prisoner programs. As these housing units and programs buildings are fully occupied, construction must be completed to the point of restoring heat to these facilities by no later than October 1, 2017.
