I am writing this letter upon becoming aware of your resolution to alter the redistricting deadlines due to the delay in the 2020 Census Data that may not arrive until as late as September 30, 2021.

This is an opportunity for the Commission to have a greater focus on community engagement in the spring and summer leading up to the Census Data release.

As a Michigan resident, it is my desire that the commission adopt this emphasis on public engagement in its modified schedule. Michigan residents such as I deserve the opportunity to have our voices heard in this process that will determine the foundation of our representation in government.

As you consider the necessary deadline changes, please maintain the originally planned number of public hearing sessions as well as you adopt these recommendations to the proposed meeting schedule:

- Population based meeting schedule: Over half a million Michigan residents live in Calhoun, Kalamazoo, and Saginaw County. Each of those locations, as well as other large population centers in Michigan, should have more opportunities to speak and add their many diverse voices to the process. Additional meeting dates in these locations would give those residents the appropriate opportunity to contribute to this process.
- Remote testimony: Allow live public testimony at every public hearing via Zoom or other remote video conferencing tool.
- Night & Weekend accessibility: If two hearings are held in a city, the commission should strongly consider hosting at least one of them in the evening (between 4-8 PM) and/or on the weekend to accommodate residents with daytime responsibilities.
- Services for non-english speakers: Translate meeting materials and content into multiple languages, particularly in communities such as Dearborn, Muskegon, Grand Rapids, Detroit and Warren with a substantial number of non-English speaking residents.

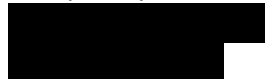

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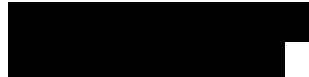

Hello-

I received notice of the public meeting location schedule, and while I am pleased that you will be doing more than the 10 required meetings, I do not feel this will adequately serve the people of the 1st Congressional District. The District is larger than the entire state of West Virginia, and comprises 16 counties, yet there are only two meetings scheduled within it. Most folks in the Northern Lower will drive about 2-3 hours round trip to centrally located Gaylord, which is about what we expect for our rural area. But, I do not believe choosing a single location at the midpoint of the UP serves Yoopers well. A citizen in a prior Commission meeting requested citizen meetings in two UP locations, and it is a shame the Commission chose otherwise.

For the record, I am not a Yooper, but have driven across the UP enough to know that Marquette is a loooong way from the cities at either end. Driving 300 miles and over 5 hours round trip for a meeting is unreasonable. Technically, folks from St. Ignace or the Sault could attend the Gaylord meeting, as it is a closer location mile-wise. But it still costs the same or more for the trip, as there is \$8 bridge fare, and it is entirely feasible that the bridge could be closed due to bad weather. Maybe it is cultural, not sure,

but I have never met a Yooper who drives below the bridge unless necessary for medical or employment reasons.

Assuming there will be an online participation option, but yet again, not great for folks in rural areas who tend to be older, with fewer/no computer skills, or have connectivity issues due to the nature of where we live. It seems rather unfair that some of the poorest people who are least likely to have computer access in the state have to spend the most in travel money, and drive the furthest to reach a public meeting. This is how things often work from Lansing, but I thought it would be different with an independent Commission. If possible, it would be great if you could consider these things and advertise the heck out of the UP and Gaylord meetings to increase participation. I am doing what I can to let people in my area know about the Gaylord meeting.

I urge you all to please keep in mind the needs of rural people with this redistricting process.

I am writing to support a change in the 10th Congressional District.

Huron County, at the northernmost tip of Michigan's "Thumb", is currently gerrymandered into a district, that's population center is nearly 100 miles to the south---northern Macomb County.

I am suggesting moving Huron County back to a district that includes its neighbor to the west, Bay County. Bay and Huron Counties share the Saginaw Bay shoreline from Port Austin to Bay City. Not only is Bay Co. closer to Huron Co., Bay City is a source of news coverage for Huron Co., both in print media (Bay City Times) and TV media (WNEM-TV). Additionally, Huron Co. residents tend to shop in the Bay City malls, and dine in their restaurants, which are less than a hour's drive from many parts of Huron Co.

Additionally, Tuscola County, also in the 10th District and southwest of Huron Co. could be combined with Saginaw Co. and/or Bay Co. The resulting boundaries would be contiguous with each other and form a rectangle of the 4 counties compared to an irregularly shaped district that exists currently. It is my understanding that Huron and Bay Counties were in the same district just 10 years ago.
