



Public Comment Engagement

Before drawing any lines, the MICRC needs to host at least ten public hearings. Per the Michigan Constitution, the purposes for the public hearings are to:

1. Inform the public about the redistricting process.
2. Share the purpose and responsibilities of the commission.
3. Solicit information from the public about potential redistricting plans for the Michigan Congressional, House, and Senate districts.

The MICRC voted to host 16 public hearings. Below represents the level of engagement.
