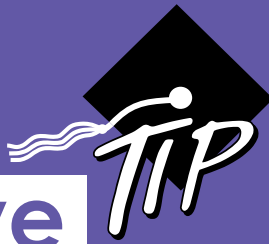


Tuition Incentive PROGRAM



What is TIP?

The Tuition Incentive Program encourages students to complete high school by providing college tuition assistance after graduation towards a certificate or associate degree.

After earning a certificate, associate degree, or 56 transferable credits, the student can then be eligible to receive up to \$500 per semester while pursuing a bachelor's degree, not to exceed \$2,000 total.

Have you ever been Medicaid eligible?

If so, then you might be TIP eligible! If you qualified for Medicaid for at least 24 months within a 36-consecutive month period between age nine and high school graduation. You are encouraged to contact MI Student Aid for more information.

What institutions participate in TIP?

See the reverse side of this flyer to learn which institutions participate and how much TIP covers at the different types of institutions. Note: Only the first institution listed on your FAFSA will be notified of your eligibility for TIP.

Are there any additional program requirements?

Yes, students must also:

- Earn a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent prior to age 20.
- Submit a FAFSA.
- Be a Michigan resident.
- Be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or approved refugee.
- Enroll at least half-time at a participating Michigan institution.
- Not be in default status on a Federal student loan.
- Meet the institution's Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards.
- Begin using TIP at a participating institution within four years of high school completion.
- Be aware that all program eligibility expires ten years after initial enrollment.

How do I check my eligibility?

* Institutions are eligible for Phase I benefits; however, may have limited associate and certificate degree programs. Be sure to work with the institutions to ensure your program of interest is offered and will accept Phase I benefits.

Phase I:

Must be enrolled in a certificate or associate degree program and taking at least six credits within that degree program. Provides tuition assistance for 24 credits per academic year determined by school type and up to \$250 per semester of mandatory fees. TIP will not cover contact hours or tiered tuition rates.

Phase II:

Must be enrolled in a bachelor's degree program and have a certificate, associate degree, or 56 transferable semester credits. Assistance up to \$500 per semester; maximum \$2,000 over program.

Community College:

Phase I uses the applicable in-district or out-of-district tuition rate. Some community colleges are authorized to offer bachelor's degrees. Contact your college to see how this may impact TIP eligibility.

Public Universities:

Phase I tuition rates are determined annually. Contact the Customer Care Center for the current academic year's rate.

Independent or Private Colleges and Universities:

Phase I uses the average community college tuition rate (determined yearly). Contact the Customer Care Center for the current academic year's rate.
