



GEAR UP College Day Scholarship Fact Sheet Academic Year 2013-14



Description

Gaining Early Awareness & Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP) is a federal program designed to provide early intervention services and programs to students in middle school and high school. The mission of GEAR UP is to significantly increase the number of low-income students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education. **GEAR UP/COLLEGE DAY (GUCD)** targets low-income students in the state of Michigan providing them with support services to increase their opportunity to succeed in higher education at Michigan's higher educational institutions.

Application

Each participating GUCD partner provided a rank order list of nominees from the class of 2011 and 2012 graduating seniors who participated in the program. Student Scholarships and Grants (SSG) awarded scholarships to the highest ranked nominees based on the amount of scholarship funds available. **The student is responsible for notifying SSG of a change of address or college choice.**

Program Limits

Students may receive scholarship assistance for up to five academic years to be completed within six years of high school graduation. The maximum award amount a student can receive is **\$5,550** per year for full-time enrollment; less than full-time enrollment is prorated. GUCD funds may be used for educational cost, including Estimated Family Contribution (EFC); not to exceed the cost of attendance. Future awards are subject to available and approved funds.

Eligibility

General eligibility requirements include:

- Have successfully completed the GUCD six-year program.
- Possess a high school diploma or GED certificate.
- Initiate postsecondary enrollment prior to age 22.
- Demonstrate financial need by being eligible for a Pell Grant for the first year of the award.*
- Enroll at least half time at an approved Michigan public degree-granting college or university.
- Be a Michigan resident prior to enrolling in college.
- Be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident or approved refugee.
- Not be incarcerated.
- For renewal, meet institution's satisfactory academic progress (SAP) policy for scholarship continuation.
- Must not be in default on Federal/State student loan.

*Non-Pell eligible students may be awarded if funds are available.

Order of Scholarships Awarded to Students

The Federal Pell Grant must be awarded first; other public and private grants, scholarships or tuition discounts second; the GUCD Scholarship third; and then other financial assistance. (For example: Tuition Incentive Program (TIP) is restricted to tuition and mandatory fees only, whereas GUCD funds can be used to cover any educational expenses.
