High School Graduation Requirements Confirmed by CEPI

Recently, MiSSG received updated high school graduation data from CEPI. The high school graduation completion information may be confirmed in the Student Information section of MiSSG. If the 'HS Grad Confirmed by CEPI' indicates "Yes," this can be used as documentation for a program review. If the status is "No" or blank, the institution must provide proof of high school completion. The 'HS Grad Confirmed by CEPI' information can also be found on the 'Eligible Students Report' and 'Information Roster.'


There are two ways to update the record:

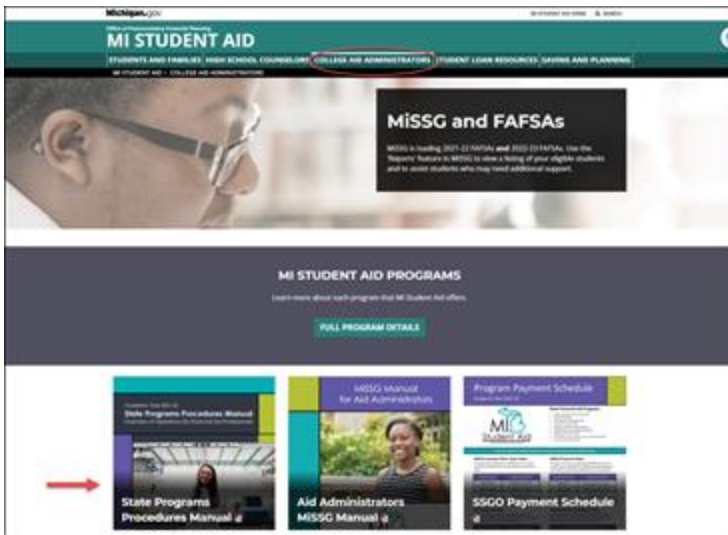

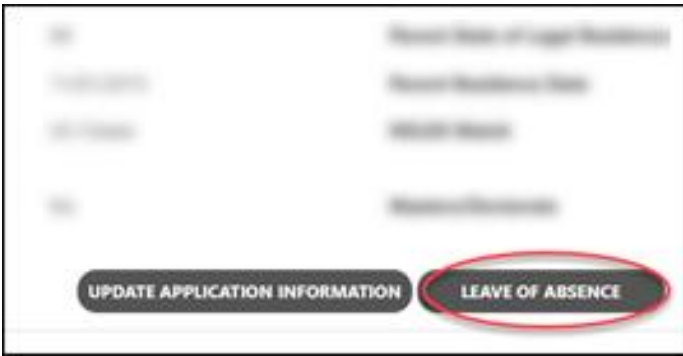

Leave of Absence

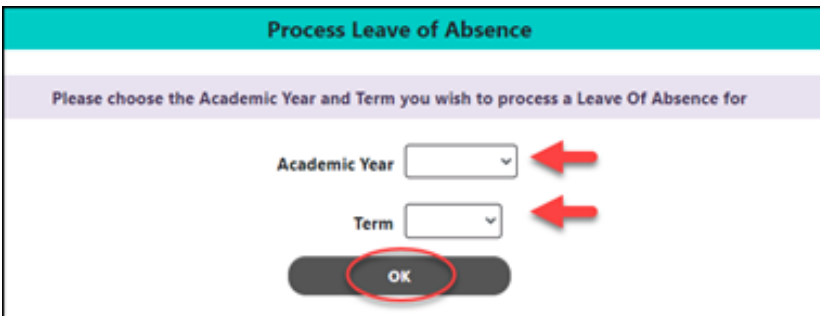
MiSSG School Users with an access level of Update 1 (U1) or Administrator 1 (A1) are now able to update Futures for Frontliners (F4F) and Michigan Reconnect Scholarship (Reconnect) students who have been approved for a Leave of Absence. All other users can view the student's Leave of Absence status. If the student is absent for more than one term, a Leave of Absence will need to be processed for each term.

To add a Leave of Absence to a student's record:

1. From the student's Application Information section, select the 'Leave of Absence' button.



2. Select the Academic Year and Term and click, 'Ok.'



3. Enter a comment and click, 'Process Leave of Absence.'

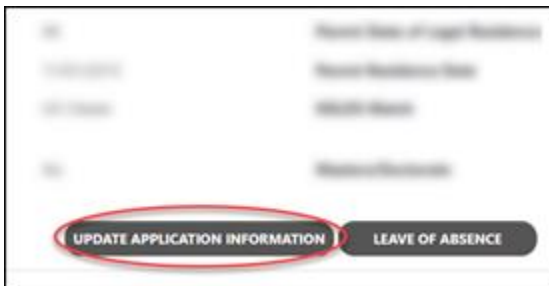

Associates Degree/Certificate Entry


MiSSG School Users with an access level of Update 1 (U1) or Administrator 1 (A1) are now able to update a F4F or Reconnect student's record with the date they earned an associate degree and/or certificate. All other users can view the student's associate degree and/or certificate entry date.

There are two ways to update the record:

 - To process manually:

Greetings Financial Aid Administrators,

On Wednesday, September 29, 2021, Governor Whitmer signed the Fiscal Year 2022 (FY22) budget which funds Student Scholarships, Grants and Outreach (SSGO) programs for Academic Year 2021-22. All programs received appropriations, which allow them to remain funded. Below you will find details on Academic Year 2021-22 State Financial Aid Program updates.

FY22 Budget Updates

Children of Veterans Tuition Grant (CVTG)

- \$2,800 annual maximum award.

Fostering Futures Scholarship (FFS)

- \$3,000 annual maximum award.

6. Click **Save**.

For private institutions, once the MCS budget is entered, the MTG budget fields will populate automatically with the same budget information. No further action is required in the MTG school profile regarding the budget after MCS is updated.

If a budget is not entered by October 2, your 2021-22 budget information will be used for 2022-23 awards.

1. Log into MiSSG, click on the **Michigan Competitive Scholarship** menu.
2. Click **School Profile**.
3. Change the Academic Year at the top of the screen from **Year 2021-22 to 2022-23**.
4. Click **Budget**.
5. Enter both the Tuition and Fees and Room and Board using your institution's **2021-2022 budget information**.
NOTE: if there is **no change** to budget amounts, please click, "The budget amounts have been reviewed and approved," check box.
6. Click **Save**.

For private institutions, once the MCS budget is entered, the MTG budget fields will populate automatically with the same budget information. No further action is required in the MTG school profile regarding the budget after MCS is updated.

If a budget is not entered by October 2, your 2021-2022 budget information will be used for 2022-23 awards.

TIP Phase I Maximum Annual Credit Increase

Based on feedback from institutions, we anticipated an increase to the TIP Phase I maximum annual credits from 24 to 30 beginning with Academic Year 2021-22. Our hope was to announce the annual credit increase along with news of the Fiscal Year 2022 (FY22) budget and State financial aid program updates. Due to the current timing of the FY22 budget, we moved forward with adding the changes to MiSSG. You will notice as of September 7, 2021, the credit adjustment is reflected. We are hopeful this change will support our students towards the completion of their degree.

Message from the Director

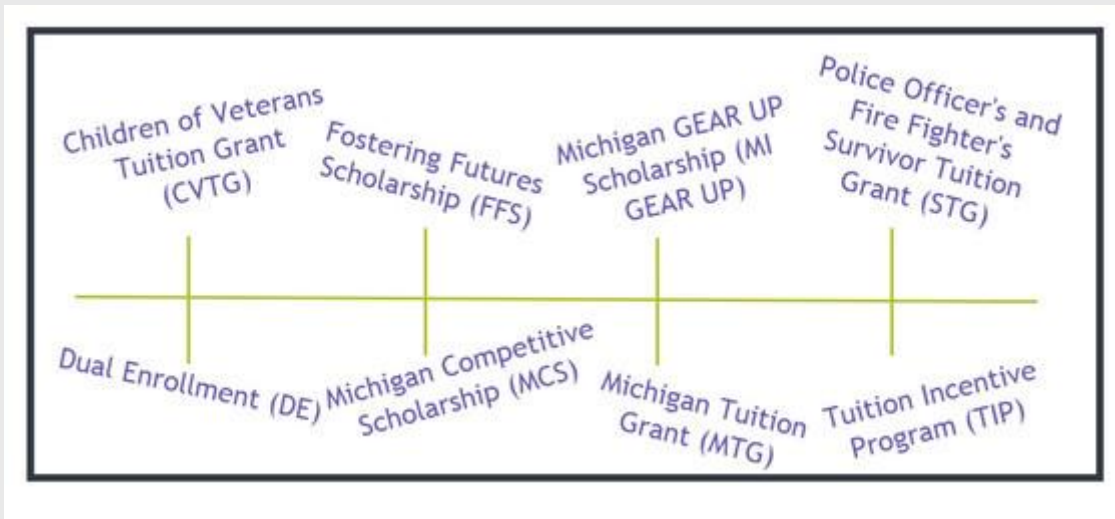

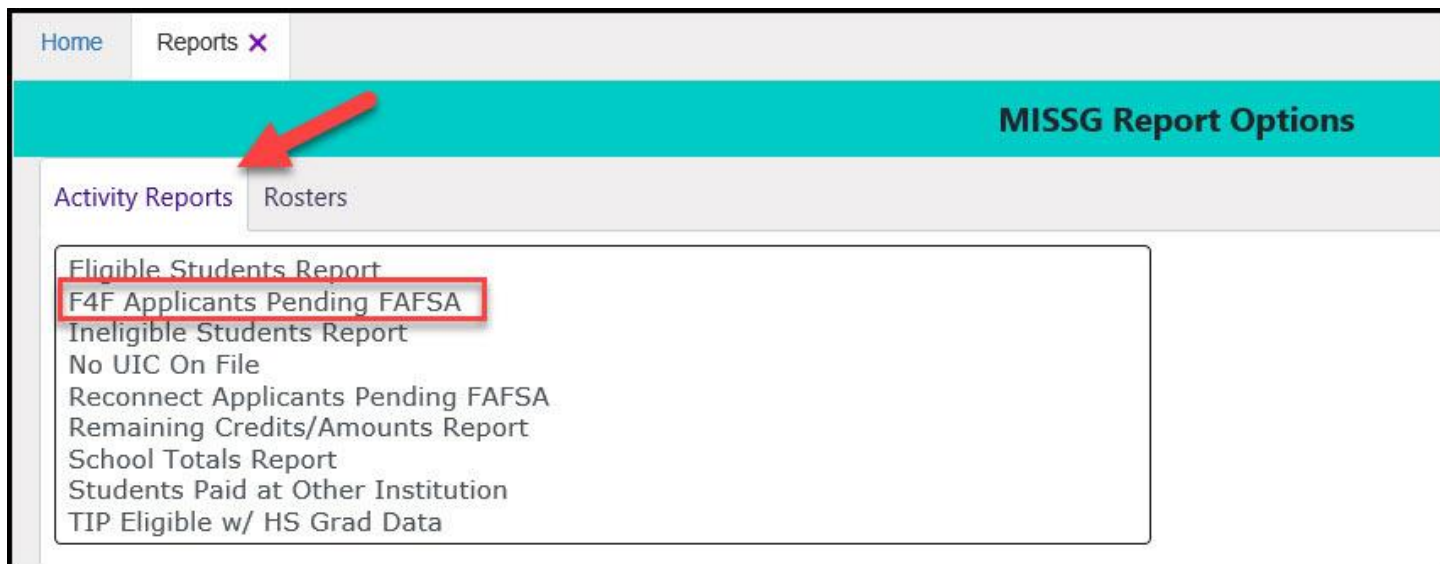

Greeting Financial Aid Professionals,

Recently, the Governor signed two new bills that would allow additional consideration and extension of awards for the Michigan Competitive Scholarship (MCS) and Michigan Tuition Grant (MTG).

- HB 4055 (Modifies MCS)
- HB 4056 (Modifies MTG)

Student Scholarships, Grants and Outreach (SSGO) is currently working on policy exceptions for students from the graduating Class of 2021 who were unable to take the SAT test. We are currently considering a possible extension for these students to take the SAT. SSGO is also researching alternative options to the SAT test.

Additionally, we are currently working with our vendor to implement modifications to the data management system, MiSSG, to provide award extensions to eligible MCS and MTG students.

As we work to finalize the policy changes and updates to MiSSG, we will communicate additional details.
