Do you currently have voice or broadband service and want to lower the bill? If you are low-income, you may be eligible for a discount on voice and/or broadband service. The federal Lifeline program makes voice and broadband service more affordable for incomeeligible families. If you qualify, you can receive a discount for monthly telephone and/or broadband service from your wireline, wireless, or broadband provider.

Federal Lifeline benefits if income eligible:

- Discount of \$5.25 per month off of your voice only service.
- Discount of \$9.25 per month off of your broadband only service.
- Discount of \$9.25 per month off of your bundle service (voice and broadband).

NOTE: Some wireless companies may provide free phones and free service for low-income customers. Check with wireless phone companies

How do I apply for Lifeline?

Contact your local landline telephone company, wireless provider, or broadband provider to apply.

You may also contact the MPSC, at 800-292-9555, for a list of wireline and wireless <u>participating companies</u>.

*Companies require annual re-enrollment and verification of income eligibility.

Who is eligible?

The Following are the current eligibility criteria for the federal Lifeline program. To qualify for Lifeline, your household income must be at or below the 135%

guidelines listed in the chart, or you must participate in one of the following assistance programs:

- Medicaid
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance (Section 8)
- Tribal Eligibility Programs (and living on federally-recognized Tribal lands), or
- Veterans Pension or Survivors Pension Program

Additional eligibility:

Survivors of domestic violence, human trafficking, and related crimes may qualify for up to six months of emergency Lifeline support. After six months a survivor would have to apply for the standard Lifeline benefit. To qualify for the survivor benefit, your household income must be at or below the 200% poverty guidelines listed in the chart below, or you must participate in one of the previously listed assistance programs or one of the following assistance programs:

- Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)
- Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch or
- Breakfast program, including enrollment at a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school or school district
- Received a Federal Pell Grant in the current award year

Survivors will need to provide a document from their service provider showing proof of an attempted line separation request. Survivors cannot successfully complete their application for emergency Lifeline support without this document.
