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ESG: Reminder for Required Forms

Routine monitoring of MSHDA ESG grantees gives our MSHDA team indicators of missing items or common errors that can occur within participant files receiving financial assistance via Rapid Re-Housing or Homelessness Prevention. Here are a few examples:

- Completed VAWA documents (especially the VAWA lease addendum)
- Rent Reasonableness (now completed through Go Section
 8)
- Form #21 Rental Assistance Agreement and Lease Addendum

Each of these are HUD requirements and must be completed as part of any rental assistance provided. We recommend taking time to review participant files on a regular basis to ensure these forms are completed fully and correctly.

Written comments must be received by 5:00 pm on Friday, February 28, 2020.

ESG and Prioritization: What's Required?


Prioritization is a critical aspect of any Coordinated Entry System. Each CoC and Local Planning Body (subset of the Balance of State CoC) is responsible for determining and implementing which factors should be considered when prioritizing literally homeless households for any rental assistance.

At a minimum, HUD requires the consideration of length of time homeless and a standardized assessment of vulnerability for the purpose of prioritization. For the purposes of ESG, MSHDA requires the use of the Vulnerability Index - Service Prioritization Decision Assistance Tool (VI-SPDAT) to meet the requirement of standardization.

Does this mean that these are the only factors communities can consider? No. Each community can - and should - review data from the Coordinated Entry System to determine any number of weighted factors which could impact prioritization.

Does this mean that the score provided by the VI-SPDAT is the primary factor for prioritization? No. While standardized assessment is required, it is not necessarily designed to be the deciding factor for household prioritization and should be weighted based on each communities' review of data from the Coordinated Entry System.
