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CARES Act: MSHDA ESG NOFA Release

Today MSHDA released the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) and all application documents for the state's ESG funding under the CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Stability Act). All documents and funding allocations by Continuum of Care (CoC) or Local Planning Body (LPB) were sent to CoC/LPB leadership and confirmed ESG fiduciary points of contact. If you are one of these points of contact and did not receive a message from your assigned MSHDA Homeless Assistance Specialist, please contact them as noted below.

CoCs and LPBs are required to review and affirm the application, budget allocations, and identified subgrantees prior to application submission. All CoC and LPB members are encouraged to review the NOFA and application documents published on the MSHDA ESG website.

Please note: The deadline for submission will be affirmed upon the release of anticipated HUD guidance for the use of CARES Act funds. HUD shared this week that the guidance could be released in the next 2-3 weeks.

As a reminder, CoCs and LPBs are encouraged to develop plans for use of the CARES Act MSHDA ESG funding with consideration of the following:

- How ESG-CV funds can work in coordination with other available funding streams
- Engaging local landlords during this crisis and beyond to quickly and effectively continue housing individuals and families experiencing homelessness
- Balancing any immediate needs such as emergency shelter with longer range planning around homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing

Update: ESG Policies and Procedures During COVID-19

MSHDA has created a document to capture all affirmed policy and procedure updates in response to the volume of changes happening within ESG during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. This is in addition to our <u>Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)</u>. Both of these documents are dated and will be updated as additional guidance is released.

IMPORTANT UPDATES:

 The HUD waivers provided for ESG and affirmed by MSHDA are ONLY applicable to current (FY2019-2020) ESG funds and NOT to the CARES Act (ESG-CV) funding as previously stated.
 This clarification was affirmed by HUD this week. All guidance

- documents have been updated to reflect this clarification.
- Starting in FY2018-2019, MSHDA instituted a rental payment requirement for households receiving financial assistance. This payment is reflective of one percent (1%) of the household's gross annual projected income and is paid either directly to the HARA or to the landlord. Until further notice, this will not be required under any ESG funding. However, CoCs and LPBs may choose to continue this practice and are still encouraged to progressively engage households to contribute to their monthly rental payment.
