Over the years you have been tasked with challenges related to the repair and replacement of job-related equipment as compared to the acquisition of new. To that end, you have conducted research via the internet and have literally obtained video information and equipment specifications to work from. This has allowed you to build machines which have resulted in the savings of thousands of dollars to Industries which ultimately affects Mr. and Mrs. John Q. Public. For example, you developed a piece of equipment that provides for the cleaning of the license plate manufacturing ink rollers. It has been so successful and works so well that one of our corporate partners (3M Corporation) has requested MSI to share this information and product specifications with other license plate operations throughout the country.
