

Of the 12 Midwestern States identified by the FBI's 2007 Uniform Crime Report (Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Wisconsin, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota), the State of Michigan reported:

- 15% of all Property Crimes
- 17% of all Burglaries
- 13% of all Larceny-Thefts
- 21% of all Motor Vehicle Thefts




- Michigan reported a *Property Crime* rate of 3,065.7 which was lower than the Regional States (Michigan, Illinois, Ohio, Indiana, Minnesota, Wisconsin) rate of 3,121.2 and the United States total rate of 3,263.5.



2007 Property Crime



- Michigan reported a *Larceny-Theft* rate of 1,898.2 which was 15% lower than the Midwestern States rate of 2,181.8.
- Michigan's *Burglary* rate of 748.9 was 11% higher than the Midwestern States rate and 4% higher than the United States total rate.



- Michigan reported a 39% higher *Motor Vehicle Theft* rate than the Midwestern States rate, a 30% higher rate than the 294.3 Regional States rate and a 15% higher rate than the United States total rate of 363.3.
- The percent of *Motor Vehicle Theft* offenses cleared by arrest or exceptional means for all agencies in the United States was 12.6% where as the clearance rate for the State of Michigan was 7.8%.
