## 2008 PRELIMINARY SEMI-ANNUAL CRIME STATISTICS JANUARY - JUNE

Preliminary figures are derived using MICR (Michigan Incident Crime Reporting) crime statistics reported for the first six months of 2008 from agencies that have jurisdiction for a community with a population of 100,000 or more. Statistics from these agencies are used since they represent the majority of the population for Michigan. The violent crime and property crime totals for these agencies have decreased for the first 6 months of 2008 when compared to previous year's figures. The four offenses in the category of **violent crime** declined, in the aggregate, 12.5%; the three offenses in the category of

property crime declined 6.8%. The number of reported arson offenses decreased 7.4%.
