



Of the 12 Midwestern States identified by the FBI's 2009 Uniform Crime Report (Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Wisconsin, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota), the State of Michigan reported:

- 14.9% of the Total Population
- 14.5% of all Property Crimes
- 16.7% of all Burglaries
- 13.2% of all Larceny-Thefts
- 20.5% of all Motor Vehicle Thefts




- Michigan reported a *Property Crime* rate of (2837.8) which was 2% lower than the Midwestern States rate of (2901.4) and 7% lower than the United States total rate of (3036.1).

- Michigan reported a *Larceny-Theft* rate of (1,782.6) which was 13% lower than the Midwestern States rate of (2,011.5).
- Michigan's *Burglary* rate of (760.5) was 12% higher than the Midwestern States rate of (676.3) and 6% higher than the United States total rate of (716.3).



- Michigan reported a *Motor Vehicle Theft* rate of (294.7) which was 38% higher than the Midwestern States rate of (213.6) and was 14% higher than the United States total rate of (258.8).
- In 2009 12.4% of all *Motor Vehicle Thefts* were cleared by arrest or exceptional means for all agencies in the United States. The State of Michigan cleared 8% of *Motor Vehicle Thefts* by arrest or exceptional means.
