DRUGS AND ALCOHOL IMPAIR JUDGMENT, REACTION TIME AND AWARENESS.

TEEN DRIVERS ARE MORE LIKELY TO BE KILLED IN AN ALCOHOL-RELATED CRASH THAN ANY OTHER AGE GROUP.



21 IS THE MINIMUM LEGAL DRINKING AGE IN EVERY STATE.

MANY EMPLOYERS, COLLEGES, AND MILITARY RECRUITERS TAKE ALCOHOL-RELATED OFFENSES INTO CONSIDERATION WHEN HIRING OR ACCEPTING APPLICANTS.



YOUNG MALE DRIVERS ARE MORE LIKELY TO BE IN AN ALCOHOL-RELATED FATAL CRASH THAN YOUNG FEMALE DRIVERS.

16% OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS  **HAVE DRIVEN UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF MARIJUANA.**

IN 2016, 16% OF 15- TO 18-YEAR-OLD DRIVERS INVOLVED IN FATAL CRASHES HAD BEEN DRINKING.

IN 2017, 246 **PEOPLE DIED IN DRUG-RELATED CRASHES IN MICHIGAN.** 

A TEEN DRIVING WITH A BLOOD ALCOHOL CONCENTRATION (BAC) OF .08 OR ABOVE MAY BE CHARGED WITH THE ADULT CRIME OF OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (OWI).
