



LAW ENFORCEMENT INFORMATION NETWORK

This correspondence is being distributed to authorized Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) agencies as a guide to LEIN programming changes. The following functionality was installed on April 30, 2014.

The update to LEIN includes the following changes:

- The Citizenship (CTZ, scan-line 247) field was implemented on Wanted Persons, Personal Protection Order, and Missing Person records. The contents of the field must be a two letter country code [see National Crime Information Center (NCIC) Code Manual]. This field is optional for creating the record; however, the information must be entered if known. CTZ displays on both LEIN and NCIC records.
- The Ethnicity (ETN, scan-line 260) field was implemented on Wanted Persons, Personal Protection Order, and Missing Person records. ETN should be used when the subject is identified as Hispanic or Latino. The options are H – Hispanic or Latino; or N – Not Hispanic or Latino. ETN should be used with a Race of White (W). This field is optional for creating the record; however, the information must be entered when a subject is known to be Hispanic or Latino. ETN displays on both LEIN and NCIC records.
- The Additional Offenses (ADO, scan-line 95) field was implemented on Wanted Person records. NCIC only allows a single wanted person record for a particular subject to be entered by any one agency. Therefore, the ADO field is used on an NCIC wanted person to indicate whether the agency holds additional warrants on the subject. Because Michigan policy requires the entry into LEIN of every warrant on a subject, this field is not displayed on the LEIN wanted person record. Agencies that hold multiple warrants on a subject may find this field useful should they choose to enter their warrants into NCIC. ADO displays only on NCIC records.
- LEIN is now sending the NCIC Protection Order Condition (PCO) 07. When a PPO that restrains an individual's right to purchase and/or possess a firearm is entered into LEIN with either the Brady Indicator field (BRD) set to YES, or the supplemental firearm prohibition condition checked, LEIN will automatically forward PCO 07 to NCIC. The NCIC Protection Order record will display the following language:

07 – The subject is prevented from purchasing and/or possessing a firearm or other weapon.

Talon forms available through the Michigan Criminal Justice Information Network (MiCJIN) Portal LEIN have been updated to include the above changes in functionality. Agencies not using Talon through the MiCJIN Portal should contact their vendor to ensure programming is in place to utilize this functionality.
