

DEFINITION

This Burglary category is the unlawful forcible entry of a building or other structure with the intent to commit a theft or felony. This does not apply to motor vehicles or coin boxes.

ANALYSIS

VOLUME

The number of forced entry burglaries committed in Michigan in 2012 was 54,253. This is a reported decrease of 9 percent from 2011 and a 13 percent decrease since 2008.

The largest number of offenses occurred in the month of August. The least amount occurred in February.

RATE

The crime rate for this offense was 549 for every 100,000 persons. In 2011, the crime rate was 604 per 100,000 persons.

CLEARANCES

Law enforcement agencies cleared 4,429 incidents by an arrest or exceptional clearance out of the 53,922 incidents reported. This calculates to an 8 percent clearance rate.


NATURE

In 2012, property data received from law enforcement agencies reported that property loss values during the commission of the forced entry burglaries totaled \$80,492,245. Total property loss values for all property crimes was \$465,967,732. For forced entry burglaries, this equates to 17 percent of this value.


The location of the forced entry burglaries at a Residence/Home was 78 percent. Commercial/Office Buildings were burglarized 4 percent of the time.

The most forced entry burglaries in Michigan for 2012 occurred on Mondays. The least amount of incidents occurred on Saturdays.

Offenses by Month




Offenses by Day

This Burglary category is the unlawful entry, without force, with the intent to commit a theft or other felony. This does not apply to motor vehicles or coin boxes.

ANALYSIS

VOLUME

The number of entry without force burglaries committed in Michigan in 2012 was 9,370. This is a reported decrease of 5 percent from 2011 and a 16 percent decrease since 2008.

The largest number of offenses occurred in the month of July and the least amount were committed in December.

RATE

The crime rate for this offense was 95 for every 100,000 persons. In 2011, the crime rate was 99 per 100,000 persons.

CLEARANCES

Law enforcement agencies cleared 800 incidents by an arrest or exceptional clearance out of the 9,278 incidents reported. This calculates to a 9 percent clearance rate. In 2011, the clearance rate was 8 percent.


NATURE

In 2012, property data received from law enforcement agencies reported that property loss during the commission of the entry without force burglaries totaled \$14,341,003. Total property loss values for all property crimes was \$465,967,732. For entry without force burglaries, this equates to 3 percent of this value.


The location of the burglaries without force was at a Residence/Home 86 percent of the time. Parking Lot/Garage was the location for 4 percent of the offenses.

In 2012, burglaries occurred the most on Mondays while the least number occurred on Sundays.

Offenses by Month




Offenses by Day
