

By reviewing the data from the seat belt pre and post observation reports, we were able to show growth in the number of belted individuals. Also, the amount of entries we received from the middle and elementary schools coloring contests show us that student did take this information home to their parents. We were extremely happy with how many entries we received. We look forward to continuing to incorporate the younger grades into future campaigns, which as also hope to run in a more traditional format.
