## Report on Competitive School Safety Grant Program (CSSGP)

December 1, 2017

The Michigan Department of State Police (MSP) has compiled a report on the FY2017 school safety grant program required under Article XVI of 2016 PA 268. Sec. 901(3) states: “The department shall report on grant activities to the subcommittees and the state budget office by December 1, 2017, including performance outcomes as identified in individual grant agreements.”

### Overview

In an effort to improve the safety of students and school staff, the Michigan Legislature appropriated \$2,000,000 from the FY 2017 General Fund to improve the safety and security of school buildings, students, and staff through the purchase of technology and equipment, and by conducting school building safety assessments. The Michigan State Police (MSP), Grants and Community Services Division (GCSD), administered the grant funding.

In accordance with Section 901(1), applications were accepted directly from public or non-public schools, school districts, and intermediate school districts. School district and intermediate school district applications were required to be for buildings that have K-12 classrooms and students – i.e., not pre-school or administration buildings. There was a limit of one application per eligible applicant. Individual school buildings were welcome to submit their own application but must not also be included in a school district application if they submitted an individual application.

### Other Requirements/Criteria:

- The school must have had a school emergency operations plan (EOP) that has been updated after August 1, 2014, to align with the State of Michigan EOP guidance.
- The project must have started after February 28, 2017 and be completed by August 31, 2017.
- The applicant was required to include a signed letter of support from the chief local law enforcement official.
- Applications were limited to \$50,000 per application for individual schools and \$250,000 for school districts or intermediate school districts.

### Eligible expenditures included a variety of equipment to improve school safety including:

- Physical security enhancement equipment, such as door locks, proximity access card readers, keypads, motion detection systems, lighting, closed-circuit television (CCTV) systems and video intercom devices.
- Public address systems.
- Inspection and screening systems.
- Shatterproof glass/film for exterior doors and/or windows.
- Signs, such as Emergency Exit Only, Visitors Register at Front Office, etc.
- Fences and gates.
- School safety assessment.

### The following items were not eligible for the CSSGP:

- Weapons, including tasers.
- Personal body armor for routine use.
- Construction.
- Costs in applying for this grant, such as consultants, grant writers, etc.
- Expenses incurred prior to the date of the award or after the end of the grant performance period.

- Personnel costs.
- Indirect costs or indirect administrative expenses.
- All travel, including first class or out-of-state travel.
- Contributions and donations.
- Management or administrative training, conferences (only pre-approved project related training).
- Management studies or research and development.
- Memberships and dues, unless specific requirement of the project (prior approval required).
- Vehicles, watercraft or aircraft, including unmanned/remotely piloted aircraft and vehicles.
- Service contracts and training beyond the performance period of the grant award.
- Food, refreshments, snacks.

### Application Activity / Review

There were 84 applications submitted, totaling over \$4.6 million in requests. Applications were limited to \$50,000 per application for individual schools and \$250,000 for school districts or intermediate school districts. Applications were available online beginning November 1, 2016, as required per Sec. 901(2), and were due on December 15, 2016.

Awards were selected for funding based on eligibility, project description, budget narrative, budget detail, project goals, objectives, and performance measures. Priority was given to projects that involve multiple agencies working in partnership and to those applicants that did not receive a FY15 CSSGP award from the MSP. The review committee also gave priority to proposals that sought to secure exterior access points of school buildings, as this is one of the best and most cost effective ways to improve school safety and security. Grant applications were reviewed by a committee that included representatives from the MSP, the Michigan Sheriffs' Association, Michigan Association of Non-Public Schools and the Executive Office of the Governor.

### Grant Awards Overview

Grant awards were made on February 13, 2017, as required per Sec. 901(2). CSSGP recipients included 25 public school districts, 24 non-public schools and three charter schools totaling \$1,955,506. Of the \$1,955,906 awarded, schools spent a total of \$1,909,125 on access control, window film and radio systems. A detailed breakdown is included below. Grant awards were closed as of December 1, 2017.

Site visits were conducted at six schools including Bradford Academy, Fowler Public Schools, Holy Name Catholic School, Ironwood Public Schools, Perry Public Schools, and St. Mary's Catholic School. Site visits involved reviewing financial procedures and documents, retention and inventory polices and procedures, and viewing completed equipment installation. All schools selected for a site visit were found to be in compliance with grant requirements.
