Dear Service Supplier:

This letter will serve as notice, as required under Michigan Law, MCL 484.1714 (1) (g), of the 911 surcharges in Michigan that will go into effect on July 1, 2021.

In summary, the 911 surcharges apply as follows:

1. State 911 Surcharge (statewide):

- a) A monthly, statewide state 911 surcharge of 25 cents will be billed and collected from all service users (MCL 484.1401a [1]-[7] and MCL 484.1408 [1]-[3]).
- b) If a service user has multiple access points or access lines, the first 10 access points or lines are charged the 25 cent rate and each additional line is charged 1/10 of the 25 cent rate.
- c) The 911 surcharge is to be listed separately on each bill and be listed as the "State 911 Surcharge."
- d) Service suppliers may retain 2% of the state 911 surcharge for billing and collection costs (MCL 484.1408 [2]).
- e) The state 911 surcharges collected are to be remitted quarterly (along with Treasury Form 5013) to the Michigan Department of Treasury. If you have questions regarding remittance of state 911 surcharges, please contact the Michigan Department of Treasury at 517-636-0515.

2. County 911 Surcharge (local):

- a) A monthly, local (county-based) county 911 surcharge will be billed and collected monthly from all service users located within that county (MCL 484-1401b [1]-[15]). This 911 surcharge is determined at the county level.
- b) The county 911 surcharge is to be listed separately on each bill and shall state by which means (resolution or approval of the voters) the surcharge was approved by the county board of commissioners.
- c) If the surcharge was approved by the voters, the service provider's bill shall state (MCL 484.1401b (4):

"This amount is for your 911 service, which has been approved by the voters on (DATE OF VOTER APPROVAL). This is not a charge assessed by your service supplier. If you have questions concerning your 911 service, you may call (INCLUDE APPROPRIATE TELEPHONE NUMBER)."

Counties with surcharges approved by the voters are indicated in the link in the paragraph below item 2e.

- d) Service suppliers may retain 2% of the approved county 911 surcharge for billing and collection costs (MCL 484.1401b [10]).
- e) The county 911 surcharges are to be remitted on a quarterly basis to each individual county collecting a local county 911 surcharge.

The list also includes the remittance address, the contact person for remittance, and the contact person for geographical questions for each county. If you have questions as to the date of an individual county's ballot proposal, please contact the county directly.

The county 911 surcharges (#2 above) are due to the counties within 30 days of the close of each quarter and are to be remitted directly to the respective counties. Each county listed has indicated whether or not it is interested in receiving their funds via electronic transmittal. It is the responsibility of each service supplier who wishes to make its transmittal electronically to initiate contact with the county's contact person.

3. Retailer's Prepaid Wireless 911 Surcharge (statewide):

- a) A statewide retailer's prepaid wireless 911 surcharge for prepaid wireless services of 5% is collected at the point of retail sale under the provisions of MCL 484.1401c.
- b) The 911 surcharge must be either separately stated on an invoice, receipt, or other similar document that is provided to a consumer by the seller or otherwise disclosed to the consumer.
- c) A seller may retain 2% of the retailer's prepaid wireless 911 surcharges that are collected by the seller for collecting and remitting the surcharges (MCL 484.1401c).
- d) The retailer's prepaid wireless 911 surcharges collected are to be remitted monthly (along with Treasury Form 5012) to the Michigan Department of Treasury.
