

Anhydrous Ammonia is Being Stolen from Michigan Farms to Produce METHAMPHETAMINE

Formula for Disaster

METHAMPHETAMINE *Stealing the Profits from Your Land*

WHY YOU SHOULD BE CONCERNED:

Methamphetamine criminals find farms good places to set up mobile clandestine cooking sites (labs) because of their secluded location. Farms also have the key ingredient criminals need to produce Methamphetamine, anhydrous ammonia.

A lab on your property also places you and your family in great danger. Coming in contact with a lab places you in instant danger. Toxic gases, unstable/explosive chemicals, and chemical fires can result in burns, collapsed lungs, and other injuries associated with contamination and explosions.

In addition, Methamphetamine scenes are considered toxic waste sites and can cause serious environmental damage to soil, ground-water, and drinking water.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR:

- Evidence of activities (usually at night) in secluded locations
- Signs of tampering with tanks, and the theft, of anhydrous ammonia
- Strong chemical odors
- Suspicious chemical spills
- Iodine (crystals or liquid) and Red Phosphorous being purchased in large quantities
- Discarded Methamphetamine cooking paraphernalia like large quantities of empty aerosol cans containing engine-starting fluid, cold medicine packages, plastic bottles with hoses, lithium batteries, and small coolers.

HOW DO I REPORT METHAMPHETAMINE ACTIVITY?

Individuals associated with Methamphetamine are often armed and dangerous. If you see someone involved with Methamphetamine activities on your property DO NOT APPROACH THEM! Call 911, or your local law enforcement agency, IMMEDIATELY. Advise the dispatcher that you believe the activity is associated with Methamphetamine (this will allow the dispatcher to warn and prepare responders for pending danger), then wait for the authorities.
