

**BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (BYRNE JAG) &
RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT (RSAT) AWARDS
MID MI
FISCAL YEAR 2012**

- Tri-County Metro - City of Lansing - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$205,875 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: The Tri-County Metro Narcotics Squad (Tri-County Metro) is a multijurisdictional task force operating within Clinton, Eaton and Ingham Counties. This is a continuation project, whose ongoing effort is to dismantle mid- and upper-level drug organizations. Vertical prosecution maximizes effective state/federal prosecution and forfeiture efforts.
- M.A.G.N.E.T. - County of Shiawassee - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$28,380 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: The Mid-Michigan Area Group Narcotics Enforcement Team (M.A.G.N.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional task force whose primary efforts are focused on the reduction of narcotics trafficking in Shiawassee and Gratiot counties. Team investigations are aimed at drug trafficking on all levels with an emphasis on the mid- to upper-level traffickers and methamphetamine clandestine drug labs.
- Methamphetamine in Michigan - Michigan Department of State Police - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$97,713 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: The Michigan State Police, Methamphetamine Investigation Unit will use project funds to maintain current/accurate statistics of methamphetamine clan lab responses throughout the state of Michigan. The project manager will oversee grant funding and training initiatives, which include methamphetamine awareness and drug endangered children protocols. This unit is also responsible for responding to and dismantling clan labs.
- Forensic Science Division - Michigan Department of State Police - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$450,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: The Michigan State Police, Forensic Science Division's project will provide payroll support for 11 forensic scientist positions. Through laboratory analysis of controlled substances, these positions assist multijurisdictional drug teams with the prosecution of individuals responsible for drug-related crimes.
- State Court Administrative Office - Michigan Supreme Court - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$1,800,000 for Priority Population Drug Courts.
Summary: The State Court Administrative Office Priority Population Drug Court Project targets non-violent probation violators and non-violent (particularly straddle cell) felony offenders who, based on Michigan Sentencing Guidelines, are otherwise bound for prison.
- J.N.E.T. - Michigan Department of State Police - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$70,233 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: Jackson Narcotics Enforcement Team (J.N.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional task force with full-time narcotics enforcement which focuses on mid- to high-level drug dealers in Jackson County. J.N.E.T. participates in the local drug court program and also works closely with DEA/ATF on the prosecution of large, high-profile narcotic cases.
- Lansing Police Department - City of Lansing - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$68,192 for Evidence Based Efficiency Projects.
Summary: The Lansing Police Department will hire and equip a part-time crime research technician for identification of problems, data collection and analysis of the problem, response to the problem and assessment of the effectiveness of the response.
- Michigan Department of Corrections - has been awarded RSAT funds in the amount of \$571,200 for Residential Substance Abuse Treatment.
Summary: The Michigan Department of Corrections proposes to provide residential substance abuse treatment to state prisoners consistent with RSAT expectations. Residential level treatment services shall be provided for male offenders at the Cooper Street Correctional Facility located in Jackson, Michigan and for female offenders at the Women's Huron Vally Correctional Facility in Ypsilanti, Michigan.
