

**BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (BYRNE JAG) AWARDS &
RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT (RSAT) AWARDS

FISCAL YEAR 2013**

- Lansing Police Department - City of Lansing has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$44,985 for Data Driven Approaches to Crime and Traffic Safety.
Summary: The Lansing Police Department will maintain a part-time crime analyst who will (through data driven approaches) locate crime and traffic patterns which will be used to focus dedicated patrols to address these issues.
- Michigan State Police Training Division - Michigan Department of State Police has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$124,995 for Juvenile-Focused Community Policing/Community Prosecution.
Summary: The proposal seeks to positively impact Michigan's most dangerous cities by providing a mentoring and leadership program for at-risk youth in these communities. This grant will allow young men and women, ages 14-16, from Flint, Detroit, Pontiac, and Saginaw to attend the Michigan Youth Leadership Academy free of charge.
- Tri-County Metro - City of Lansing has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$169,810 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: The Tri-County Metro Narcotics Squad (Metro) is a continuation project and ongoing effort to dismantle mid- and upper-level drug organizations. Vertical prosecution will be used to maximize effective state and federal prosecution and forfeiture efforts.
- Methamphetamine in Michigan - Michigan Department of State Police has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$50,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: This initiative will maintain current/accurate statistics associated with clan lab responses and oversee training initiatives to include methamphetamine awareness and Drug Endangered Children protocols.
- Forensic Science Division - Michigan Department of State Police has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$450,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funding provides payroll support for 11 forensic scientist positions within the Michigan State Police, Forensic Science Division. Through laboratory analysis of controlled substances, these positions assist multijurisdictional teams with the prosecution of individuals responsible for drug-related crimes.
- J.N.E.T. - Michigan Department of State Police has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$61,300 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: Jackson Narcotics Enforcement Team (J.N.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional drug enforcement concept with full-time narcotics enforcement, focusing on mid- to high-level drug dealers in Jackson County. J.N.E.T. also participates in the drug court program and works closely with the DEA/ATF on the prosecution of large and high profile narcotic cases.
- M.A.G.N.E.T. - County of Shiawassee has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$27,815 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: Mid-Michigan Area Group Narcotics Enforcement Team (M.A.G.N.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional task force whose primary efforts are focused on the reduction of narcotics trafficking within Shiawassee and Gratiot Counties. M.A.G.N.E.T. aggressively investigates those individuals who illegally manufacture/distribute methamphetamine, heroin, cocaine, and prescription drugs.

- State Court Administrative Office - Michigan Supreme Court has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$1,500,000 for Priority Population Drug Courts.
Summary: The State Court Administrative Office Byrne Justice Assistance Grant Priority Population Drug Court Project funds drug courts which target non-violent felony probation violators and non-violent straddle or presumptive cell offenders who, based on Michigan Sentencing Guidelines, are otherwise bound for prison.
- Michigan Department of Corrections has been awarded RSAT funds in the amount of \$185,084 for Residential Substance Abuse Treatment.
Summary: The Michigan Department of Corrections proposes to provide residential substance abuse treatment to state prisoners. Residential level substance abuse treatment services shall be provided for male offenders at the Cooper Street Correctional Facility located in Jackson, Michigan and for female offenders at the Women's Huron Valley Correctional Facility in Ypsilanti, Michigan. Other components include parenting skills, coping with trauma, and violence prevention.
