

**BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (BYRNE JAG) &  
RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT (RSAT) AWARDS  
MID MICHIGAN  
FISCAL YEAR 2016**

- Michigan Department of State Police - Michigan Intelligence Operations Center (MIOC) has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$342,000 for Drug Threat Assessment.  
**Summary:** The Michigan State Police, MIOC, is seeking to fill a void in the state's intelligence community and provide focused intelligence support to law enforcement, in order to improve the outcomes of investigations and provide quality, relevant, information to facilitate strategic decision-making. Three analysts will focus their efforts on illicit drug trafficking and the abuse of prescription drugs.
- Michigan State Appellate Defender Office - Crime Lab Unit has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$219,737 for Indigent Defense.  
**Summary:** The Appellate Investigation Project will provide training and investigation services to appellate-assigned counsel, who will challenge unsound evidence and develop evidence that will support legal claims for exoneration or retrial. The project will reach the 75 percent of Michigan's appellate cases that lack access to or funding for investigation; building on the successful model used at the Michigan State Appellate Defender's Office.
- Michigan Department of State Police - Prevention Services Unit has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$40,000 for Juvenile-Focused Community Policing.  
**Summary:** The project seeks to positively impact two of Michigan's impoverished cities by providing a five day long mentoring and leadership program for at-risk youth at the Michigan State Police Training Academy in Lansing, MI. This grant would allow 40 students, ages 15-16, from Benton Harbor and Inkster to attend the Michigan Youth Leadership Academy (MiYLA™) at no cost to them.
- Michigan Department of State Police - Forensic Science Division has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$400,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.  
**Summary:** The Michigan State Police, Forensic Science Division, will fund payroll support for seven forensic scientist positions. Through laboratory analysis of controlled substances, these positions will assist multijurisdictional drug teams with the prosecution of individuals responsible for drug-related crime.
- County of Shiawassee - M.A.G.N.E.T. has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$17,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.  
**Summary:** The Mid-Michigan Area Group Narcotics Enforcement Team (M.A.G.N.E.T.) will investigate narcotics violations in its jurisdiction, with the primary focus on methamphetamine, heroin, prescription drugs, and cocaine. M.A.G.N.E.T. will assist local law enforcement partners with investigating violent criminals and criminals with a drug nexus.
- Michigan Department of State Police - J.N.E.T. has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$33,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.  
**Summary:** The Jackson Narcotic Enforcement Team (J.N.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional drug enforcement concept with full-time narcotics enforcement. The team focuses on mid- to high-level drug dealers in Jackson County. J.N.E.T. also participates in the drug court program and works closely with the Drug Enforcement Administration and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives on the prosecution of large and high-profile narcotic cases.
- City of Lansing - Tri-County Metro has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$112,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.  
**Summary:** The Tri-County Metro Narcotics Squad (Metro) is a continuation project and ongoing effort to dismantle mid- and upper-level drug organizations. Collaborative law enforcement operations and vertical prosecution is used to maximize effective state and federal prosecution and forfeiture efforts.

- Michigan Department of State Police - Methamphetamine in Michigan has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$65,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.  
**Summary:** The Michigan State Police, Methamphetamine in Michigan Grant will fund overtime for the statewide response to/investigation of clandestine methamphetamine laboratories.
- Michigan Supreme Court - State Court Administrative Office has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$1,305,000 for Priority Population Drug Courts.  
**Summary:** The State Court Administrative Office will fund drug courts that target non-violent probation violators and non-violent straddle or presumptive cell felony offenders who, based on Michigan Sentencing Guidelines, are otherwise bound for prison.
- Michigan Department of Corrections - Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) has been awarded RSAT funds in the amount of \$199,600.  
**Summary:** The Michigan Department of Corrections proposes to provide residential substance abuse treatment to state prisoners. Residential level treatment services shall be provided for female offenders at the Women's Huron Valley Correctional Facility, located in Ypsilanti, Michigan.
