## **Crime Conference Session Overview**

---

### **Biometrics**

This session will provide an overview of the services provided by the newly formed Biometrics and Identification Division of the State Police, including AFIS, Live Scan, Facial Recognition, Audio/Video Analysis, Forensic Sketch Artists, Polygraph, and CODIS.

### **Interpol**

Interpol is the world's largest international police organization with 190 member countries. Their role is to enable police to work together and make the world a safer place while providing access to tools and services necessary to do the job effectively. Interpol provides targeted training, expert investigation support, relevant data and secure communications channels to help police on the ground understand crime trends, analyze information, conduct operations and ultimately arrest as many criminals as possible. An overview of the organization and how it can provide assistance to any law enforcement agency will be discussed.

### **Data Driven Approaches to Crime & Traffic Safety (DDACTS)**

DDACTS (Data Driven Approaches to Crime and Traffic Safety) integrates location-based crime and traffic crash data to establish effective and efficient methods for deploying law enforcement and other resources to locations determined to be hot spots of crime and crashes. DDACTS draws on the deterrent value of highly visible traffic enforcement to reduce the social harms caused by high crime and crashes in communities.

### **Michigan Incident Crime Reporting (MICR) Roundtable**

A panel discussion on the Michigan Incident Crime Reporting, the new enhancements to the system, crime mapping, common errors, and how to assure your data is being accurately reported.

### **N-DEx**

The National Data Exchange is a powerful investigative tool that allows law enforcement agencies to submit their data (such as incident reports, narratives, jail management data, arrest data, case reports, booking and incarceration data, etc) to a central repository where it can be searched by all law enforcement agencies. All participating agencies can see each other's data – on the originating agency's own terms.
