

**BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (BYRNE JAG) &  
RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT (RSAT) AWARDS  
SOUTHEAST MICHIGAN  
FISCAL YEAR 2016**

- City of Westland - Westland Police Department has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$65,820 for Juvenile-Focused Community Policing.  
**Summary:** The Westland Department of Housing and Community Development, along with the Westland Police Department and additional stakeholders, will create and staff a 16 student learning lab for K-12 tutoring in an at-risk neighborhood. Grant funding will provide technology and equipment needed for the learning lab, as well as providing certified educators.
- City of Wayne - Wayne Police Department has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$78,492 for Juvenile-Focused Community Policing.  
**Summary:** The City of Wayne will expand their Youth and Family Services Program (YFSP) by adding a family services coordinator to connect families to government assistance and other programs, and a new after-school program, both of which will supplement and enhance existing YFSP programming. These additions will include positive law enforcement interactions within the YFSP structure.
- Michigan Department of State Police - R.H.I.N.O. has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$30,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.  
**Summary:** The Region of Irish Hills Narcotics Office (R.H.I.N.O.) is responsible for investigating narcotics-related complaints and targeting mid- to high-level drug dealers in Lenawee and Hillsdale counties. The team partners with local agencies and assists with investigations of all crime. R.H.I.N.O. also participates in drug abuse prevention with the probate courts and local/intermediate school districts.
- County of Oakland - N.E.T. has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$134,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.  
**Summary:** The Oakland County Narcotic Enforcement Team (N.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional task force created to encourage cooperation between law enforcement agencies in southeast Michigan. N.E.T. works collaboratively with partner agencies to apprehend and convict those involved in the use, sale, and distribution of illegal drugs and narcotics.
- Michigan Department of State Police - D.R.A.N.O. - Michigan Department of State Police - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$73,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.  
**Summary:** The Downriver Area Narcotics Organization (D.R.A.N.O.) targets mid- to high-level narcotic violators in the downriver area (southwest Wayne County) working with state, local, and federal law enforcement agencies to identify drug trafficking organizations to disrupt, dismantle, and arrest violators and combat subsequent associated crimes.
- Michigan Department of State Police - L.A.W.N.E.T. has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$66,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.  
**Summary:** The Lenawee and Washtenaw Narcotics Enforcement Team (L.A.W.N.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional drug enforcement concept with full-time narcotics enforcement-related responsibilities for Livingston and Washtenaw Counties.
- Michigan Department of State Police - C.O.M.E.T. has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$90,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.  
**Summary:** The County of Macomb Enforcement Team (C.O.M.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional task force which started in 1982 and is comprised of federal, state, county, and local police officers. The team's primary function is to enforce narcotics laws, apprehend violent criminals, and support other criminal justice agencies. C.O.M.E.T. primarily serves the Macomb County area.

- Michigan Department of State Police - W.W.N. has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$68,000 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.  
**Summary:** The Western Wayne Criminal Investigations (W.W.N.) leverages state, local, and federal resources to disrupt and dismantle drug trafficking organizations and combat drug crimes and associated violent criminal activity. W.W.N. is focused on removing multijurisdictional offenders and conspirators from Western Wayne County.
- City of Canton - Canton Police Department has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$10,000 for Police-Community Relations.  
**Summary:** "Partners in Your Safety" is a program designed to build a partnership between law enforcement and neighborhoods. This partnership will promote problem-solving and communication among neighbors to help create safer communities. The program is designed to accredit individual neighborhoods, giving each of them goals to reach. Upon reaching these set goals, the neighborhood would become accredited.
- County of St. Clair - St. Clair County Sheriff's Department has been awarded Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) funds in the amount of \$55,000.  
**Summary:** The St. Clair County Sheriff's Department proposes to provide an intensive cognitive behavioral treatment program addressing the substance abuse and criminal behavior of felony offenders during incarceration. Case management will be provided as part of assessment, needs identification, and re-entry planning. The three phases of the program include intensive education, therapeutic groups, and re-entry.
