

Of the 12 Midwestern States identified by the FBI's Uniform Crime Report (Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Wisconsin, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota), the State of Michigan reported:

- 15% of the Population
- 19% of all Violent Crimes
- 17% of all Murders
- 20% of all Rapes
- 15% of all Robberies
- 21% of all Aggravated Assaults






## In 2008:

- Michigan reported a violent crime rate of nearly 502 violent crimes per 100,000 population which was 26% higher than the Midwestern States violent crime rate of 400 violent crimes per 100,000 population.
- A reduction of 10,136 violent crimes would have been required to decrease the violent crime rate in Michigan to match that of the Midwestern States violent crime rate in 2008.
- Michigan had a 10% higher violent crime rate (501.5) than the National violent crime rate (454.5).



- Michigan recorded a 32% higher crime rate for *Forcible Rape* (45.0) than that of the Midwestern States (34.0). Additionally, Michigan had a 54% higher crime rate for *Forcible Rape* than the United States rate (29.3).



- Michigan recorded a 2% higher *Robbery* crime rate (129.6) than the Midwestern States rate (126.8). However, Michigan's *Robbery* crime rate was 12% lower than the United States total rate (145.3).

- The crime rate for *Aggravated Assault* in Michigan (321.5) was 37% higher than the Midwestern States rate (234.5) and 17% higher than the total US rate (274.6).
- If the crime rate in Michigan for *Aggravated Assault* (321.5) could have been reduced to that of the Midwestern states (234.5), it would have required a reduction of 8,691 *Aggravated Assaults*.
