

Of the 12 Midwestern States identified by the FBI's Uniform Crime Report (Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Wisconsin, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota), the State of Michigan reported:

- 20% of all Violent Crimes
- 22% of all Aggravated Assaults
- 21% of all Murders
- 20% of all Rapes

Regional Violent Crime Rate








In 2007:

- Michigan reported a violent crime rate of 536 violent crimes per 100,000 population which was 30% higher than the Midwestern States violent crime rate of 411.2.
- A reduction of 12,569 violent crimes would be required to decrease the violent crime rate in Michigan to match that of the Midwestern States violent crime rate.
- Michigan had a 15% higher violent crime rate (536) than the National violent crime rate (467).



- Michigan recorded a 32% higher crime rate for *Forcible Rape* (45.5) than that of the Midwestern States (34.4). Additionally Michigan had a 51% higher crime rate for Rape than the US (30.0).



- The crime rate for *Aggravated Assault* in Michigan (350.7) was 43% higher than the Midwestern States rate (244.4) and 24% higher than the total US rate (283.8).
- If the crime rate in Michigan for Aggravated Assaults (350.7) could have been reduced to that of the Midwestern States (244.4) it would require a reduction of 10,703 Aggravated Assaults.
