

**DEFINITION**

Criminal Sexual Conduct (CSC) 1st Degree (MCL 750.520b) is the sexual intercourse of a person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or, not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity. Michigan collects the crime data for this offense based on the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS).

**Note: CSC 1st and 3rd are differentiated by the weapon involved and the degree of the victim injury.**

**ANALYSIS**

**VOLUME**

The number of victims reported for CSC - 1st Degree, Sexual Penetration - Penis/Vagina was 3,173. This is a reported increase of five percent from 2016 and an eight percent decrease from 2012.

The months of June and July had the most victims reported. The fewest number of victims were reported in December.

**RATE**

The crime rate for this offense in 2016 was 32 for every 100,000 persons. In 2015, the crime rate was 31 for every 100,000 persons, an increase of three percent.

**CLEARANCES**

Law enforcement agencies cleared 793 incidents by an arrest or exceptional clearance. This is a reported twenty-six percent clearance rate.

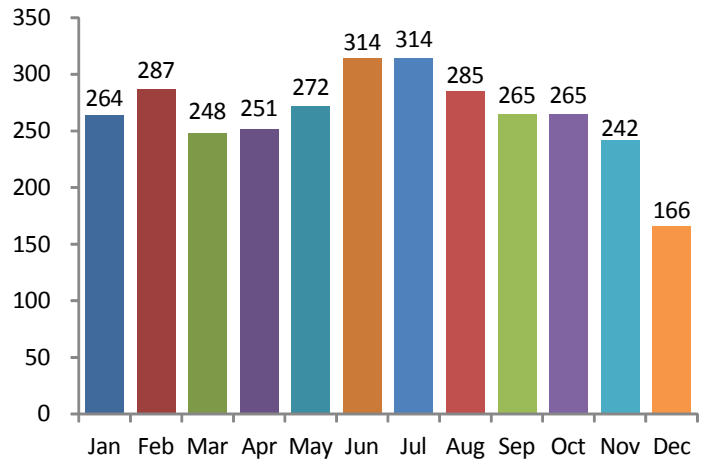
**VICTIM INFORMATION**

Seventy-four percent of the victims did not receive any injury. There were seventeen percent of victims who received Apparent Minor injuries and seven percent received Possible Internal injuries.

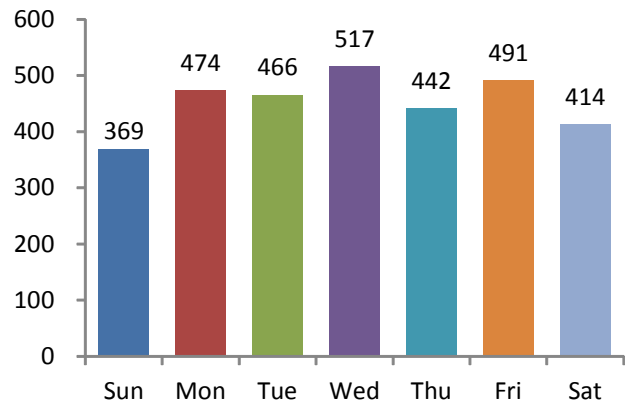

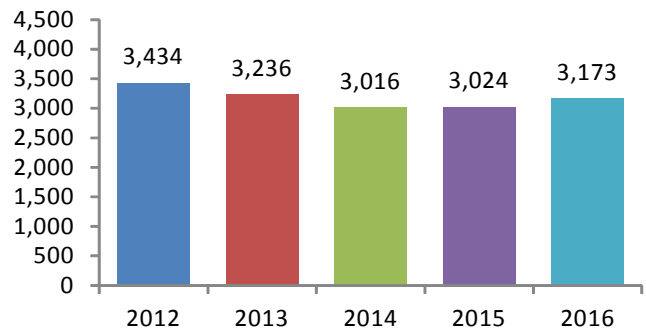


**Victims by Day**

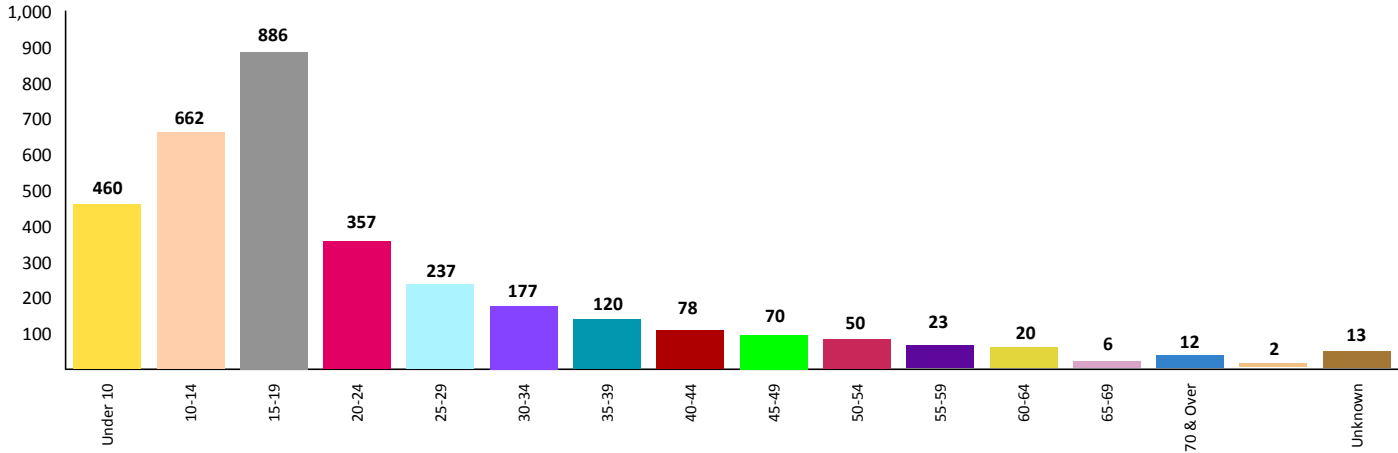

More victims were reported in the month of May than any other month. The fewest number of victims were reported in December. The most victims were reported on Tuesdays.

**RATE**

The crime rate for this offense in 2016 was 12 for every 100,000 persons, which is a reported increase of nine percent from 2015.

**CLEARANCES**

Law enforcement agencies cleared 333 incidents by an arrest or exceptional clearance out of the 1,152 incidents that were reported. This is a reported twenty-nine percent clearance rate.

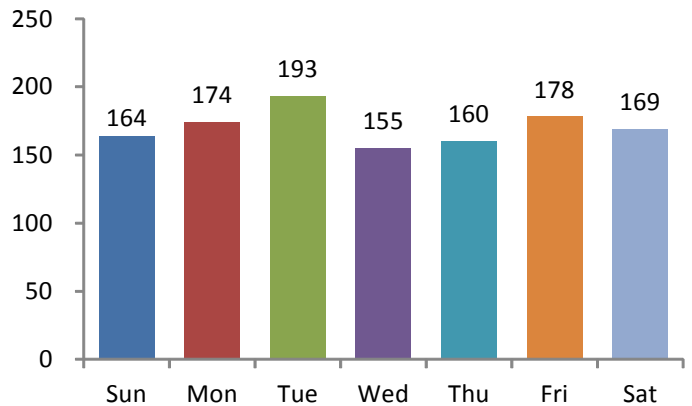

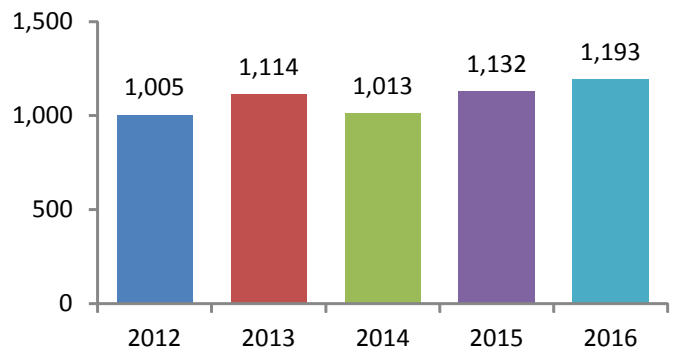

Michigan collects the crime data for this offense based on the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS).

**Note: CSC 1st and 3rd are differentiated by the weapon involved and the degree of the victim injury.**

**ANALYSIS**

**VOLUME**

The number of victims reported for CSC - 3rd Degree, Sexual Penetration - Object was 197. This is a reported increase of eleven percent from 2015 and a twenty percent increase from 2012.

More victims were reported in the month of February than any other month. The fewest number of victims were reported in December. The most victims were reported on Tuesdays and Fridays equally.

**RATE**

The crime rate for this offense in 2016 was two for every 100,000 persons, which is the same rate that was reported in 2015.

**CLEARANCES**

Law enforcement agencies cleared 50 incidents by an arrest or exceptional clearance out of the 189 incidents that were reported. This is a reported twenty-six percent clearance rate.

**VICTIM INFORMATION**

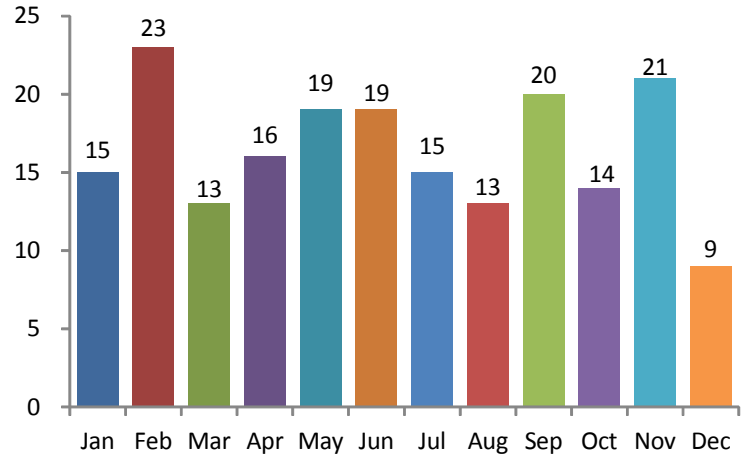
Eighty-five percent of the victims did not receive any injury. There were eleven percent of victims who received Apparent Minor injuries.

Fifty-eight percent of the victims did not have a weapon used against them. The most used weapon, occurring thirty-four percent of the time, was a Personal Weapon meaning hands, fists, feet, etc.

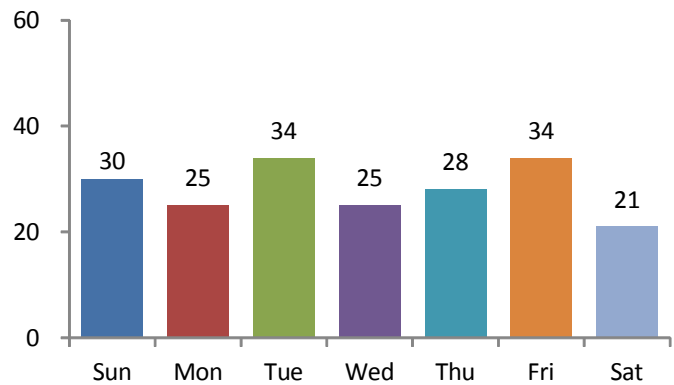
When reviewing the Victim to Offender relationships, twenty-six percent of the time, the victim was an Acquaintance of the offender. With fifteen percent of the victims, the Victim to Offender relationship was Otherwise Known.

**Victims by Month**

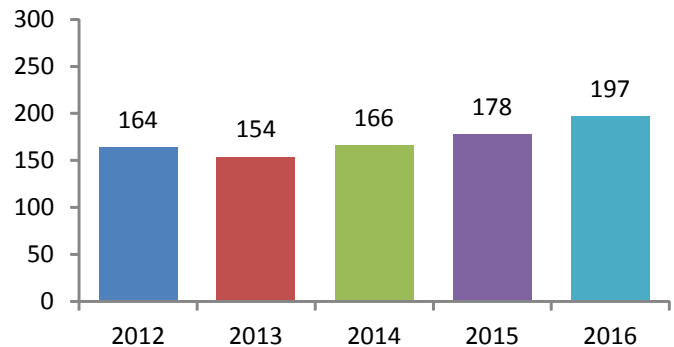


**Victims by Day**



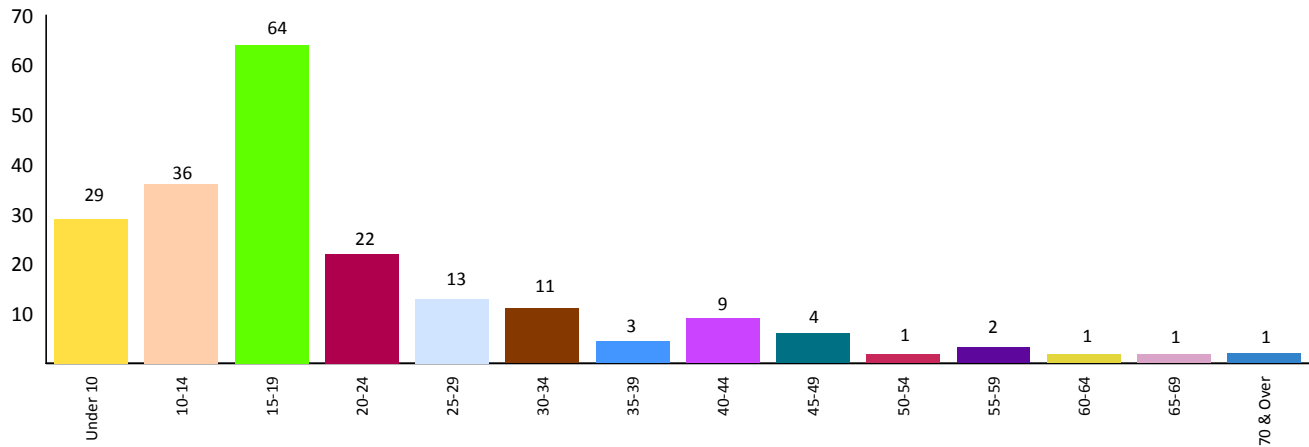
**5-Year Trend**

**Number of Victims**

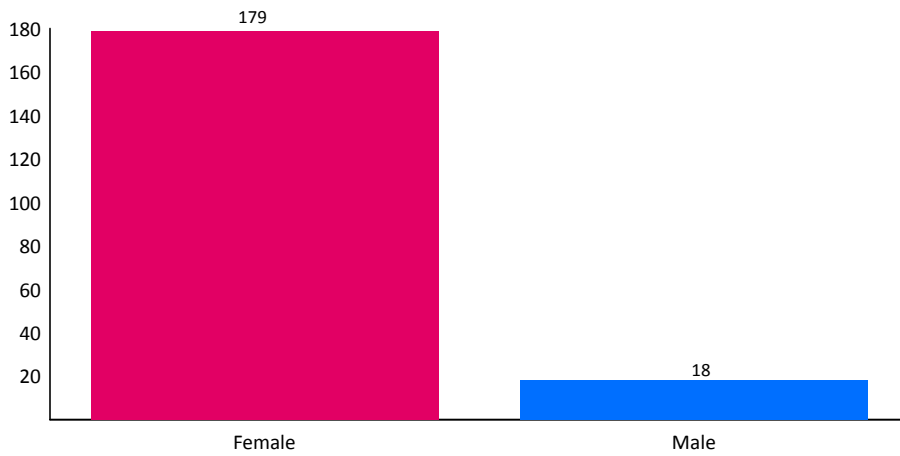




**Age of Victims**



**Gender of Victims**

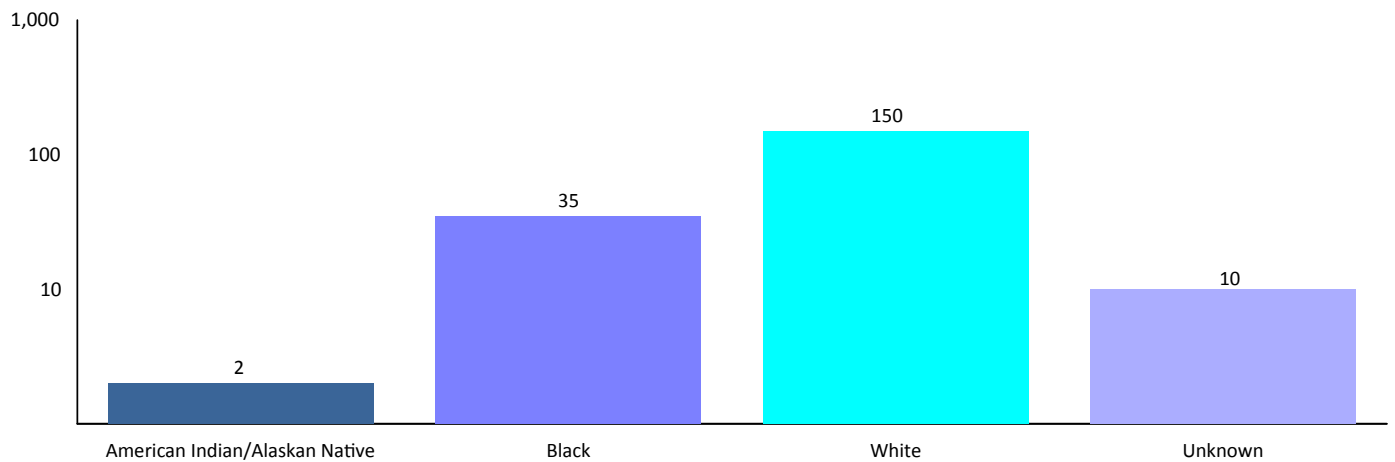

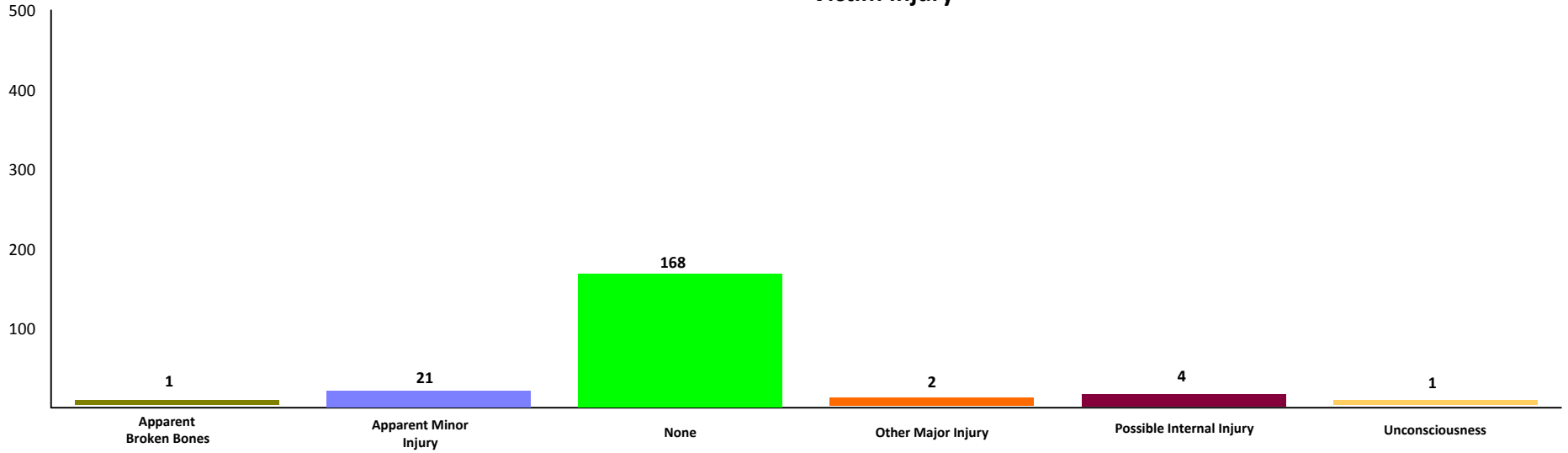

**Race of Victims**

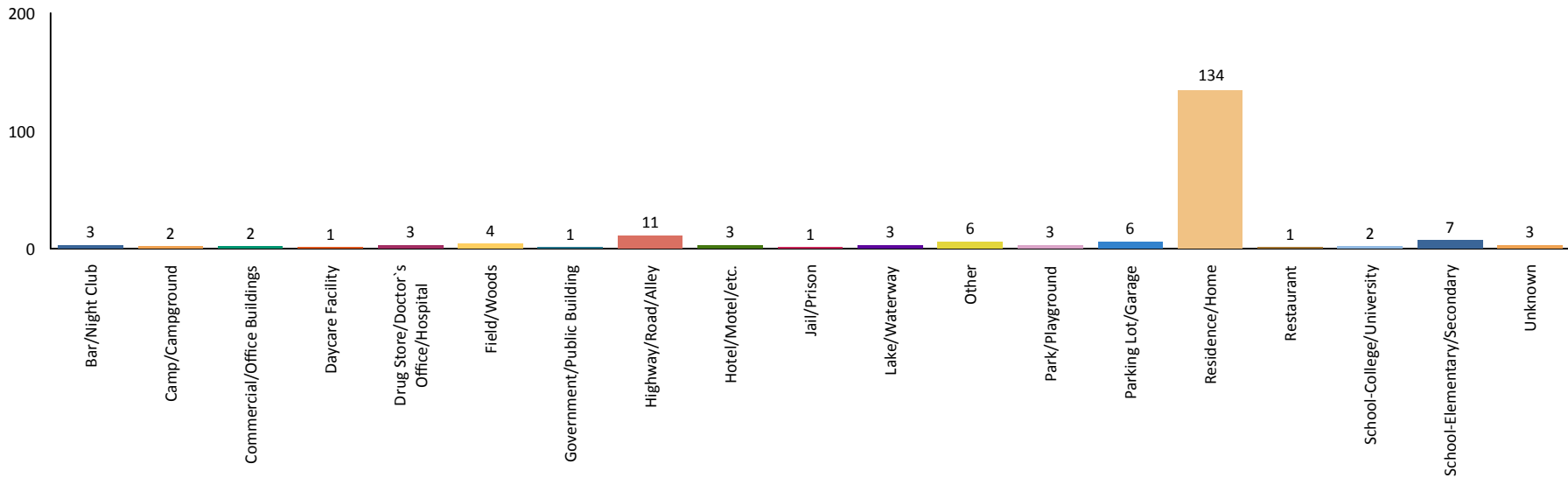




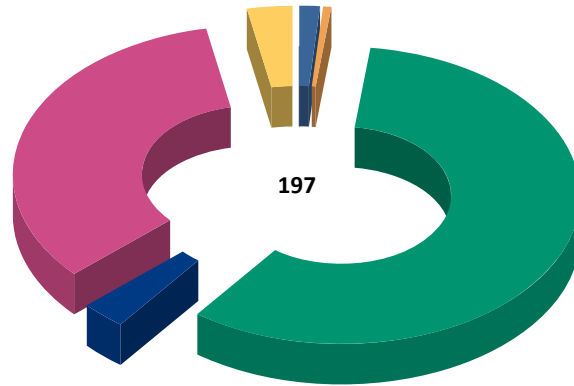
**Victim Injury**



**Location of Crime**

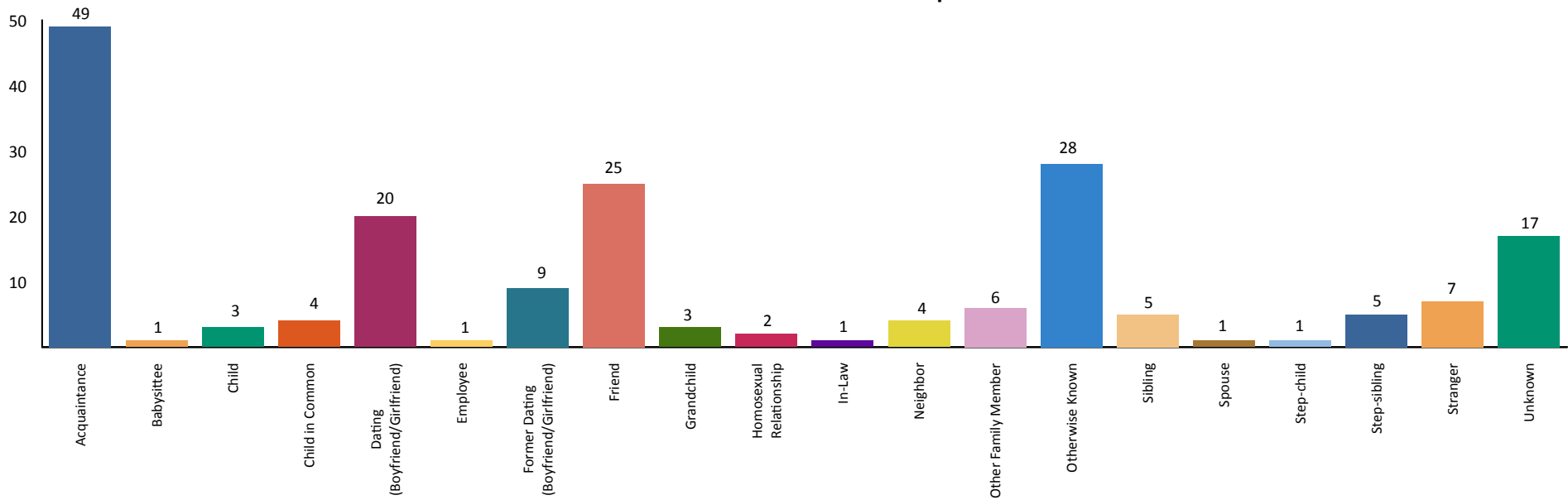
