






Tip 1: "Protect your information!"


Only share your passwords with your parents.

Tip 4: "Don't be a bully!" Mean words are just as powerful on screen as they are in person. Be tolerant, kind and respectful and stand up for each other.






Hidden Pictures:

· tell a trusted adult if anything makes me feel sad, or confused.


- · not meet face-to-face with anyone from the internet.

Parents: Become Cyber Warriors for your children! Always...

- ·Place laptops, tablets and cell phones in a common area to allow observation of your child's internet activity.
- ·Create rules for internet use, including which sites can and cannot be accessed.
- ·Research and use parental controls that are available on connected devices.
- ·Teach your child to never give out personal information, such as home address, phone number, email address, passwords, photographs, credit card number or school information.
- ·Know who your child is talking to online.
- ·Remember that internet technology can be mobile so monitor cell phones, gaming devices and laptops.
