NOTICE OF PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD AND PUBLIC MEETING

The Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) is hosting a public meeting and accepting public comments regarding Wolverine World Wide's Residential Well Resampling Response Activity Plan for the North Kent Study Area, Plainfield and Algoma Townships, Kent County.

Written comments are being accepted until **July 18, 2020**, on a Response Activity Plan (ResAP) for Residential Well Resampling in the North Kent Study Area that Wolverine World Wide (Wolverine) is required to conduct per the February 19, 2020, Consent Decree between the State of Michigan, Algoma and Plainfield Townships, and Wolverine.

The Residential Well Resampling ResAP summarizes the phased approach Wolverine will take to resample residential wells located within the North Kent Study Area which are not receiving municipal water (i.e. Filter Areas as defined in the Consent Decree), and do not have a point-of-entry treatment system (POET) installed by Wolverine. The homes with the least amount of sampling data and the highest PFAS concentrations will be sampled first, with the goal of resampling each residence within the Filter Areas of the North Kent Study Area that has not been sampled two or more times as of February 19, 2020. This residential well resampling will be completed over the course of three years.

The portions of this Residential Well Resampling ResAP document that were already subject to the public notice and comment period for the February 19, 2020, Consent Decree are not subject to change based on this new public participation process. The portions that were previously publicly noticed can be found in Appendix M – Residential Well Resampling Statement of Work of the February 2020 Consent Decree posted online here: www.michigan.gov/belmont.

A paper copy of the report is also available for review at the City of Rockford, Algoma Township, and Plainfield Charter Township offices. The review period will last at least 30 calendar days from the date of this publication.
