

February 19, 2020 Consent Decree

- Consent Decree between the State of Michigan (Plaintiff), Plainfield and Algoma Townships (Intervening Plaintiffs) and Wolverine (Defendant) became effective on Feb. 19, 2020 (www.Michigan.gov/Belmont)
- Serves as the framework for all future PFAS response activities performed by Wolverine in the "North Kent Study Area"
- Wolverine will conduct these activities under EGLE oversight

- House Street Disposal Site Source Control (Section 7.8)











Wolverine's consultant anticipates obtaining access and completing the installation of well clusters proposed in this work plan over the course of the next 11 months.



After completion and 4 quarters of sampling of the completed perimeter well network, GZA will meet with EGLE to discuss the data and determine next steps.

Completion Report (Section 7.12 (v)) due within 2 years of the installation of perimeter wells. Must contain a longterm maintenance and monitoring plan.
