## STATE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AND HOMELAND SECURITY AMENDMENT TO GOVERNOR'S PROCLAMATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on April 17, 2014, the Governor declared a State of Emergency for the county of Marquette due to widespread and severe deep frost levels caused by extended extreme cold temperatures; and

WHEREAS, the counties of Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Chippewa, Delta, Emmet, Gogebic, Luce, and Mackinac suffered similar damages and impacts from widespread deep frost levels caused by extended extreme cold temperatures; and

WHEREAS, the counties of Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Chippewa, Delta, Emmet, Gogebic, Luce, and Mackinac declared a local State of Emergency and activated the emergency response and recovery elements of their emergency operations plan to cope with the situation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, CHRIS A. KELENSKE, as designee for the State Director of Emergency Management and Homeland Security, pursuant to the provisions of Section 407 of Act No. 390 of the Public Acts of 1976, as amended, do hereby, with the concurrence of the Governor, amend the State of Emergency declaration to include the counties of Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Chippewa, Delta, Emmet, Gogebic, Luce, and Mackinac; and

FURTHERMORE, I certify that the emergency response and recovery elements of the Michigan Emergency Management Plan and the aforementioned local political subdivisions' emergency operations plans were activated in a timely manner to administer and manage this emergency; and

FURTHERMORE, the Emergency Management and Homeland Security Division of the Michigan State Police shall coordinate and maximize all state efforts to assist the local political subdivisions and may call upon all state departments to utilize resources at their avail to assist in the emergency area pursuant to the Michigan Emergency Management Plan; and

FURTHERMORE, termination of this emergency in the counties of Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Chippewa, Delta, Emmet, Gogebic, Luce, and Mackinac will occur at such time as emergency conditions no longer exist and appropriate programs have been implemented to recover from the effects of this emergency, but in no case longer than May 15, 2014, unless extended as provided by Act No. 390, as amended.
