**STATE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AND HOMELAND SECURITY  
AMENDMENT TO GOVERNOR'S DECLARATION OF STATE OF DISASTER**

WHEREAS, on April 17, 2014, the Governor declared a State of Disaster for the counties of Newaygo and Osceola due to widespread and severe flooding and wind damage caused by severe storms, snowfall and heavy rains; and

WHEREAS, the counties of Isabella, Mecosta, Missaukee, Muskegon, Roscommon, and Wexford suffered similar damages and impacts from flooding and wind damage caused by severe storms, snowfall and heavy rainfall; and


WHEREAS, the counties of Isabella, Mecosta, Missaukee, Muskegon, Roscommon, and Wexford declared a local State of Emergency and activated the disaster response and recovery elements of their emergency operations plan to cope with the situation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, CHRIS A. KELENSKE, as designee for the State Director of Emergency Management and Homeland Security, pursuant to the provisions of Section 407 of Act No. 390 of the Public Acts of 1976, as amended, do hereby, with the concurrence of the Governor, amend the State of Disaster declaration to include the counties of Isabella, Mecosta, Missaukee, Muskegon, Roscommon, and Wexford; and

FURTHERMORE, I certify that the emergency response and recovery elements of the Michigan Emergency Management Plan and the aforementioned local political subdivisions' emergency operations plans were activated in a timely manner to administer and manage this disaster; and

FURTHERMORE, the Emergency Management and Homeland Security Division of the Michigan State Police shall coordinate and maximize all state efforts to assist the local political subdivisions and may call upon all state departments to utilize resources at their avail to assist in the disaster area pursuant to the Michigan Emergency Management Plan; and

FURTHERMORE, termination of this disaster in the counties of Isabella, Mecosta, Missaukee, Muskegon, Roscommon, and Wexford will occur at such time as emergency conditions no longer exist and appropriate programs have been implemented to recover from the effects of this disaster, but in no case longer than May 15, 2014, unless extended as provided by Act No. 390, as amended.
