

# INVESTING TO MOVE FLINT FORWARD

*In his State of the State address, Governor Snyder asked the legislature to pass a \$28 million supplemental budget to provide critical clean water resources for the people of Flint.*

## \$28 MILLION FOR:

### FINDING THE BEST SOLUTIONS

- Costs of the Michigan National Guard's deployment
- Infrastructure integrity study using outside experts
- Operational funding for the Flint Water Interagency Coordinating Council
- Payment to city to aid utility issues



### SCHOOLS AND CHILDREN

- Replacement of fixtures in schools, daycare facilities, and hospitals
- Treatment for kids with high blood-lead levels: diagnostic tests, nurse visits, environmental assessments
- Child and adolescent health centers and additional support necessary for children's healthcare access
- Support for WIC nutrition education and screening for children, lactation consultations for moms
- Additional nurses in Flint schools
- Funding for the Genesee Intermediate School District for Early On and special education, nutrition, literacy support, and staffing for health professionals



### HEALTH

- Emergency purchases of bottled water, water filters, and replacement cartridges to ensure safe drinking water for every resident in the city
- Lab and testing costs
- Funding for the Genesee County Food Safety Division for food inspections at licensed food establishments
- Contractual expertise to assess potential linkages to Legionnaire's disease
- Epidemiologists to analyze blood lead levels
- Further lead investigations
- Nurse care management
- Additional positions for community education
- Crisis counseling through local community mental health
- Resources to help with lead abatement
