FUNDING TO CLEAN UP THOUSANDS OF CONTAMINATED SITES STATEWIDE



The nearly depleted 1998 CMI bond funded **\$675 million** of contaminated site remediation and environmental activities

The current CMI bond leaves our kids with debt while burdening taxpayers with a **50% markup** totaling over **\$1 billion in costs** for the bond



The cost of Gov. Snyder's proposal would be about **\$4.75 per household, per year**

There are **14 confirmed sites** in Michigan with emerging PFAS contaminant issues

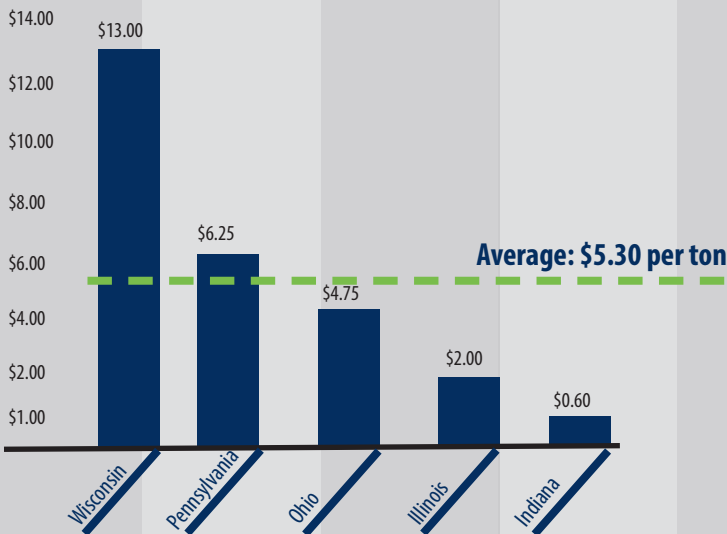


17 million tons of trash are disposed each year in Michigan



Michigan's **15% recycling rate** is one of the lowest in the nation

EXISTING SOLID WASTE TIPPING FEES



3,000 contaminated, abandoned sites throughout Michigan need remediation



\$100 million backlog in state parks for park clean up and utility upgrades



25.5% of Michigan's trash is imported from other states/countries in part due to low tipping fees



RAISING MICHIGAN'S EXTREMELY LOW \$0.36/TON LANDFILL FEE TO \$4.75 WILL GENERATE \$79 MILLION PER YEAR

MICHIGAN'S ENVIRONMENTAL NEEDS

\$79 MILLION ANNUALLY IS NEEDED TO ENSURE A SAFER, CLEANER ENVIRONMENT

CATEGORY

ANNUAL AMOUNT

1. REMEDIATE AND REDEVELOP EXISTING AND FUTURE CONTAMINATED SITES

\$45 million

- Clean up 300 sites annually, in all 83 counties
- Address emerging contaminants

2. SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

\$9 million

- Enhance solid waste planning for local governments
- Increase asbestos removal oversight for blighted communities

3. RECYCLING GRANTS TO TRIPLE MICHIGAN'S RECYCLING RATE

\$15 million

- Provide recycling grants to local entities for recycling infrastructure, market development and education

4. WATER QUALITY MONITORING GRANTS

\$5 million

- Monitor beaches to keep them clean
- Reduce phosphorus in Lake Erie
- Remove contamination in rivers, lakes and streams

5. STATE PARK INFRASTRUCTURE

\$5 million

- Address infrastructure backlog in state parks
