Missaukee County Veterans Park Millage

Shall the County of Missaukee levy a tax in an amount not to exceed twenty cents per thousand dollars (.20 per \$1,000) of taxable value on all taxable property in Missaukee County for 1 (one) year – 2012 – in order to develop and create a Missaukee County Veteran’s Memorial Park on Prospect Street in the city of Lake City?

If approved and levied in its entirety in the first year following authorization, this millage would raise an estimated \$120,137.60.

Aetna Township Road Millage Renewal

Shall the previous voted increase in the tax limitations imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6, of the Michigan Constitution on general ad-valorem taxes within Aetna Township be renewed at 2 mills (\$2.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015 inclusive, for the purposes of Road Construction and Maintenance and shall the Township of Aetna levy such renewal in millage for said purpose, thereby raising in the first year an estimated \$44,000.00?

If approved and levied in its entirety, in the first year following authorization this millage would raise \$18,863.97

Shall the Township of Butterfield, County of Missaukee, State of Michigan renew a tax in the amount not to exceed \$1.50 per thousand dollars \$1,000 (1.5 mill) of Taxable Values on all taxable property in Butterfield Township for 4 (four) years – 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 inclusive in order to continue providing Fire Protection including building and equipment maintenance?

If approved and levied in its entirety, in the first year following authorization this millage would raise \$28,295.95.

Shall the Township of Clam Union, Missaukee County, Michigan renew the 1.0 mill (1.00 per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation) for a period of four (4) Years from 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015 inclusive for the purpose of Road Construction and Maintenance and to authorize the Township to levy the said 1.0 mill for the 4 year period stated above?

If approved and levied in it entirety in the 1st year following authorization this millage would raise an estimated \$30,386.00.

Shall the Township of Clam Union, Missaukee County, Michigan renew the 1.0 mill (1.00 per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation) for a period of six (6) Years from 2012 thru 2017, for the purpose of continuing to provide Fire Protection including building and equipment purchases and maintenance?

If approved and levied in it entirety in the 1st year following authorization this millage would raise an estimated \$30,386.00.

Forest Township Road Millage Renewal

Shall the Township of Forest, Missaukee County, Michigan renew a tax in an amount not to exceed \$1.00 per thousand dollars (1.00 mill) of the taxable value on all Real and Personal Property located within Forest Township for 4 years from 2012 through 2015 for the Maintenance and Construction of existing Roads within Forest Township?

If approved and levied in its entirety in the 1st year following authorization this millage would raise an estimated \$27,453.50.

Norwich Township Fire Millage Renewal

Shall the Township of Norwich be authorized to levy 1 Mill (\$1 per \$1,000 of taxable value) upon the Taxable and Real and Personal Property within the Township of Norwich for a period of 4 years (2012-2015 inclusive) for the purpose of Fire Protection?

If approved and levied in its entirety in the 1st year following authorization, this millage would raise an estimated \$27,066.00.

Reeder Township Fire Millage Renewal

Shall the Township of Reeder, County of Missaukee, State or Michigan be authorized to levy an additional 1 mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000.00 taxable value) upon the taxable real and personal property within the Township of Reeder for a period of four (4) years, 2012 through 2016, inclusive, to provide funds to support and maintain fire protection in Reeder Township.

If approved and levied, this millage would raise an estimated \$31,670.00 in the first year of levy this being a renewal.

Riverside Township Road & Bridges Millage Renewal

Shall the Township of Riverside, County of Missaukee, State of Michigan be authorized to levy (1) Mill (\$1.00 per thousand (\$1,000.00) of taxable value) upon the Taxable and Real and Personal Property within the Township of Riverside for a period of (4) four years (2012 through 2015 inclusive) to provide funds to maintain and reconstruct roads and bridges in Riverside Township?

If approved and levied, this millage would raise approximately \$34,000.00 in the first year of levy.

Operating Millage Renewal Proposal Lake City Area School

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Lake City Area Schools, Missaukee County, Michigan, be increased by 18 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 3 years, 2012, 2013 and 2014, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2012 is approximately \$2,540,000 (this is a renewal of millage which expired with the 2011 tax levy)?

Bonding Proposal McBain Rural Agricultural School

Shall McBain Rural Agricultural School, Missaukee, Wexford, Clare and Osceola Counties, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Nine Hundred Ninety-Five Thousand Dollars (\$995,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefore, for the purpose of:

Acquiring, installing and equipping technology for school facilities; acquiring and installing educational technology; purchasing school buses; remodeling and equipping the transportation facility; and developing and improving the site?

The following is for informational purposes only:

The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2012, is .50 mill (\$.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a -0- net increase in debt millage. The maximum number of years the bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is seven (7) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is .72 mill (\$.0.72 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation).

If the school district borrows from the State to pay debt service on the bonds, the school district may be required to continue to levy mills beyond the term of the bonds to repay the State.

(Pursuant to State law, expenditure of bond proceeds must be audited, and the proceeds cannot be used for repair or maintenance costs, teacher, administrator or employee salaries, or other operating expenses.)

McBain Rural Agricultural School**

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in McBain Rural Agricultural School, Missaukee, Wexford, Clare and Osceola Counties, Michigan, be increased by 18 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for the year 2012 to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2012 is approximately \$1,043,128 (this is a renewal of millage which expired with the 2011 tax levy)?

**Special Education Millage Proposal
(Restoration of Headlee Reduction)**

This proposal requests additional millage to permit the continued levy by the intermediate school district of the maximum mills for special education previously approved by the electors.

Shall the current charter limitation on the annual property tax rate for the education of students with a disability in Wexford-Missaukee Intermediate School District, Michigan, be increased by .3295 mill (\$0.3295 on each of taxable valuation), for a period of 3 years, 2012, 2013 and 2014, (this increase will allow the intermediate school district to levy the maximum rate of 3.50 mills previously approved by the electors which has been reduced as required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963); the estimate of the revenue the intermediate school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2012 is approximately \$601,561 from local property taxes authorized herein?

Wexford Missaukee ISD Special Education Millage Proposal with yes having received the most votes and it was declared that this proposal did Pass.
