



Why do you want to serve on the Michigan Independent Citizens Redistricting Commission?

I am an independent voter. I do not vote for any particular party, only for the candidate and/or plans and policies that will best represent and benefit the State of Michigan and its citizens. I am interested in elections that are fair and impartial with all voters having an equal chance of having their candidate elected; that does not happen when districts are drawn to produce a predetermined outcome. I will make reasonable, rational and impartial decisions in order to facilitate fair, impartial elections.

The results of any election should accurately reflect the choices of the electorate. Gerrymandering skews those results in favor of the political party holding the majority in state government following the national census every 10 years, giving the party drawing the districts an advantage in future elections. At its extreme, gerrymandering ensures that one party remains in power regardless of how the electorate may vote.

Impartial determinations regarding the configuration of congressional districts is essential to accurate representation of the interests of the people of Michigan. Our Congressional representatives should be accountable to the electorate. Their work on behalf of the voters should be subject to scrutiny, their performance should be reviewed at the end of each term and the decision as to whether they remain in office should be made by the voters, not because the seat is "safe" because of political manipulation.

Describe why or how you affiliate with either the Democratic Party, Republican Party, or why you don't affiliate with either.

In order to obtain a primary ballot I have, in the past, been forced to declare a preference for a political party in order to vote for a particular candidate. Over the course of several election cycles I have declared a preference for both parties. However, I consider myself to be an independent voter. I vote for the candidates that I believe will best benefit the citizens of Michigan. I consider the platform of each party and well as the issues and the experience and character of the candidates. I have voted for candidates from both parties based on performance. I will continue to do so.

Public office holders should be accountable to those they represent. They should be mindful of the needs and interests of the people. Elections require the representatives to act on the citizens' behalf. They are end of term "performance reviews" for politicians. Voting independently gives me the ability to evaluate the office holder and other candidates and then vote to extend or end the term of our public employees. Decisions based on policies, platforms, issues, experience, character and performance are important. Impartial elections matter.
