Michigan Independent Citizens Redistricting Commission for Fair Elections

In November 2018, Michigan voters decisively supported a constitutional amendment that makes a commission of 13 randomly selected citizens – not elected politicians, consultants or lobbyists – responsible for drawing fair and representative election districts for the Michigan Legislature and U.S. Congress.
