The State Tax Commission (Commission) has received a resolution from the City of Port Huron regarding the transfer of Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Certificate Number 3-10-0026, transferred to Sperry's Theatre Corp., located at 301 Huron Ave. in the City of Port Huron.

Public Act 146 of 2000, the Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Act (Act), provides for the transfer of a certificate by the legislative body of the qualified local governmental unit. The Act does not require action by the Commission following the transfer by a qualified local governmental unit. However, the Commission acknowledges the transfer of Certificate number 3-10-0026 as approved by the City of Port Huron and will change our records to reflect this transfer. The resolution will be filed for future reference.

A party aggrieved by the issuance, refusal to issue, revocation, transfer or modification of this exemption certificate may appeal a final decision by filing a petition with the Michigan Tax Tribunal, www.michigan.gov/taxtrib, within 35 days. MCL 205.735a (6).
