#### RELEASE AND SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This Release and Settlement Agreement, dated June \_\_\_\_\_, 2016 is between the City of Flint and David Cox, Jr. (collectively the "City") and Mark Stratman ("Stratman").

#### Recitals

WHEREAS, Stratman filed a lawsuit against the City and Cox regarding his employment with the City of Flint Fire Department, discipline he received during that employment and the circumstances under which he was named a Provisional Captain. That lawsuit, <u>Stratman v Cox, et al.</u> Case No. 15-104485-CZ is now pending in the Genesee County Circuit Court ("the Lawsuit");

WHEREAS, Cox and the City deny the allegations made in the Lawsuit and have vigorously defended against his claims that they treated him unfairly or unlawfully;

WHEREAS, the parties are desirous of resolving the Lawsuit on the terms and conditions outlined in this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL COVENANTS contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The City shall pay Stratman the following:
  - a. The sum of \$20,000; and
  - b. Payment equal to 24 hours of in-grade classification seniority (as worked) and wages as District Commander (Q 038), formerly known as Fire Battalion Chief (F5 Q016) or, in the event of name change, the highest ranking fire suppression officer in the City of Flint Fire Department.
- 2. In consideration of the settlement payment and other obligations of this Agreement, Stratman releases and forever discharges the City and Cox, including but not limited to their employees, agents, officers, elected officials, departments, successors and assigns, from all actual and potential claims, complaints, demands, causes of action, damages, costs, expenses, fees and other liabilities of every sort and description, direct or indirect, fixed or contingent, known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, and whether or not liquidated, including, without limitation, claims based on pre-existing acts occurring at any time up to the date of this Agreement, which may result in future damages or injuries (collectively "the Claims"), arising out of, caused by, or otherwise related in any way to:
  - a. His employment with the City of Flint Fire Department, including

- any discipline levied against him during that employment;
- b. The facts and circumstances surrounding transfer to or from the rank of District Commander;
- c. Violations or alleged violations of any federal or state statutes or common law or of any law, statute, ordinance or contract;
- d. Failure on the part of the City and Cox of any duty or obligation whatsoever and/or commitment by them of any tort or engagement by them in any kind of wrongful conduct;
- 3. Stratman expressly waives any legal or equitable remedies that may have been or currently are available to him, including but not limited to any claim for attorney fees.
- 4. The parties intend that this Agreement be read as broadly as possible such that the City and Cox will have no further obligations or liability of any sort or nature to Stratman, directly or indirectly, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement.
- 5. The City and Cox do not concede or admit that, with respect to Stratman, they have violated any laws, statute, ordinance or contract or have failed in any duty or obligation whatsoever and/or have committed any tort or engaged in any kind of wrongful conduct. Indeed, the City and Cox specifically deny that they engaged in any such conduct. The City and Cox enter into this Agreement solely in the Interest of avoiding additional costs that would result from continued litigation and Stratman acknowledges that the consideration described in this Agreement is adequate and sufficient and represents a full and complete settlement of any claims and/or rights as more fully described above.
- 6. This Agreement embodies the entire understanding of the parties and all of the terms and conditions with respect to the matters discussed in this Agreement; it supercedes and annuls any and all other or former agreements, contracts, promises or representations, whether written or oral, express or implied, made by, for, or on behalf of the City and Cox and it may not be altered, superceded or otherwise modified except in writing, signed by the party to be charged. All executed copies of this Agreement and duplicate originals are equally admissible as evidence.
- 7. This Agreement must be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Michigan. If any of the provisions of this Agreement are, for any reason, held to be invalid or unenforceable, the provision will not affect any other provision of this Agreement, but this Agreement will be construed as if the invalid and/or unenforceable provision had never been

contained in the Agreement.

8. Upon receipt of payment of the consideration noted above, Stratman shall cause the Lawsuit to be dismissed with prejudice and without costs and attorney fees to any party.

# SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS BETWEEN THE CITY OF FLINT AND ITS AGENTS AND EMPLOYEES AND DAWAN SIMPKINS

In consideration of the agreement set forth below, **DAWAN SIMPKINS** (hereinafter "Plaintiff"), heis heirs and personal representatives, fully and forever release and discharge the City of Flint, its agents, employees, officers, representatives, and elected officials, both past and present (collectively referred to as "City"), from any and all claims, demands, actions, and causes of action of every kind, nature, or description, whether known or unknown, which Plaintiff may have had, may now have, or may hereafter have arisen before the date of the Settlement Agreement and Release of All Claims (hereinafter "Agreement") including, but not limited to, any and all claims, by reason of any matter, cause, act, or omission arising out of or in connection with the incident giving rise to the lawsuit of *Dawan Simpkins*, *Plaintiff*, *v. City of Flint*, *Defendant*, Case No. 15-104809-NI, Honorable Joseph J. Farah.

- 1. Any claims heretofore made shall forthwith be dismissed with prejudice and without the payment of costs, interest, or attorney fees by any party.
- 2. In consideration for signing the Agreement and the fulfillment of the promises herein, the City shall pay Plaintiff a sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00).
- Plaintiff agrees that he will not file a lawsuit or claim of any type in any forum against the City for actions arising prior to the date of the execution of the Agreement, and that if he does, the lawsuit or claim will be immediately dismissed; and Plaintiff will pay to the City all of the costs, expenses, and attorney fees incurred by the City in defending against such a lawsuit or claim. However, nothing in the Agreement shall prevent Plaintiff from filing suit to challenge the Agreement or to enforce the terms of the Agreement.
- 6. The above commitments by the City are undertaken solely to avoid the inconvenience and cost of defending against claims or potential claims by Plaintiff and for no other reason. Plaintiff accordingly acknowledges and agrees that the consideration stated above is made and accepted in settlement and compromise of disputed claims, and shall not be construed to be an admission of liability by the City, by whom any liability to Plaintiff is expressly denied.

- It is further understood and acknowledged that the terms of the Agreement are contractual and not a mere recital and that there are no agreements, understandings, or representations made by the City, except as expressly stated.

This Agreement contains the entire agreement and understanding between Plaintiff and the City with respect to any and all disputes or claims that the Plaintiff had, or could have had, against the City as of the date the Agreement is executed, and supersedes all other agreements between the Plaintiff and the City with regard to such disputes or claims. The Agreement shall not be changed unless such change is made in writing and is signed by both the Plaintiff and the City.
- 8. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of the Agreement shall not affect or impair any other provisions, which shall remain in full force and effect. If any portion of the Agreement is found invalid, the parties agree to enter into a full and general Release by Plaintiff that is not invalid.
- 9. Plaintiff acknowledges that he was advised to and did consult with an attorney prior to executing the Agreement.

# SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS BETWEEN THE CITY OF FLINT AND ITS AGENTS AND EMPLOYEES AND BRENDA SHIVERS

In consideration of the agreement set forth below, **BRENDA SHIVERS** (hereinafter "Plaintiff"), her heirs and personal representatives, fully and forever release and discharge the City of Flint, its agents, employees, officers, representatives, and elected officials, both past and present (collectively referred to as "City"), from any and all claims, demands, actions, and causes of action of every kind, nature, or description, whether known or unknown, which Plaintiff may have had, may now have, or may hereafter have arisen before the date of the Settlement Agreement and Release of All Claims (hereinafter "Agreement") including, but not limited to, any and all claims, by reason of any matter, cause, act, or omission arising out of or in connection with the incident giving rise to the lawsuit of *Brenda Shivers*, *Plaintiff*, *v. City* of *Flint*, *Defendant*, Case No. 15-105476-NI, Honorable Richard B. Yuille.

- 1. Any claims heretofore made shall forthwith be dismissed with prejudice and without the payment of costs, interest, or attorney fees by any party.
- 2. In consideration for signing the Agreement and the fulfillment of the promises herein, the City shall pay Plaintiff a sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00).
- 3. Plaintiff agrees that she will not file a lawsuit or claim of any type in any forum against the City for actions arising prior to the date of the execution of the Agreement, and that if she does, the lawsuit or claim will be immediately dismissed; and Plaintiff will pay to the City all of the costs, expenses, and attorney fees incurred by the City in defending against such a lawsuit or claim. However, nothing in the Agreement shall prevent Plaintiff from filing suit to challenge the Agreement or to enforce the terms of the Agreement.
- 6. The above commitments by the City are undertaken solely to avoid the inconvenience and cost of defending against claims or potential claims by Plaintiff and for no other reason. Plaintiff accordingly acknowledges and agrees that the consideration stated above is made and accepted in settlement and compromise of disputed claims, and shall not be construed to be an admission of liability by the City, by whom any liability to Plaintiff is expressly denied.

- 6. It is further understood and acknowledged that the terms of the Agreement are contractual and not a mere recital and that there are no agreements, understandings, or representations made by the City, except as expressly stated.
- 7. This Agreement contains the entire agreement and understanding between Plaintiff and the City with respect to any and all disputes or claims that the Plaintiff had, or could have had, against the City as of the date the Agreement is executed, and supersedes all other agreements between the Plaintiff and the City with regard to such disputes or claims. The Agreement shall not be changed unless such change is made in writing and is signed by both the Plaintiff and the City.
- 8. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of the Agreement shall not affect or impair any other provisions, which shall remain in full force and effect. If any portion of the Agreement is found invalid, the parties agree to enter into a full and general Release by Plaintiff that is not invalid.
- 9. Plaintiff acknowledges that she was advised to and did consult with an attorney prior to executing the Agreement.

Plaintiff has executed this Agreement and has acknowledged that she executed it as her own free act and deed.

## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR THE WSU/MOU

his Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into as of the last date of signature on the signature page of this Agreement ("Effective Date") by and between Flint Police Foundation, Inc. ("Foundation") whose address is: PO Box 13503, Flint, MI 48501 and The City of Flint / Flint Police Department ("Customer") whose address is: 210 E. 5th Street, Flint, MI 48501 as follows:

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Foundation has received approval for a grant from the Ruth Mott Foundation ("Grant") to provide funding for project assistance and technical services from the Wayne State University, Center for Urban Studies ("Center") for the benefit of the Customer; and

WHEREAS, the Customer has fully and independently investigated the Center and the products and/or services that are anticipated to be furnished pursuant to the Wayne State University, Center for Urban Studies, Memorandum of Understanding ("WSU/MOU") between the Foundation and the Center (attached as Exhibit A); and

WHEREAS, the Customer has requested that the Foundation provide the financial support to allow for the implementation of the project assistance and technical services from the Center; and

WHEREAS, the Customer has agreed to hold harmless and indemnify the Foundation for all actions related to the project assistance and technical services from the Center;

NOW, THEREFORE, based on the foregoing premises and the promises set forth below, the Parties agree as follows:

#### <u>AGREEMENT</u>

- 1. The Customer warrants and agrees that it has fully and independently investigated and approved the Center, and the products and/or services that are anticipated to be furnished pursuant to the WSU/MOU and all the terms and conditions contained therein.
- 2. The Customer warrants and agrees that it shall have complete and exclusive control over the implementation of the project assistance and technical services from the Center.
- 3. The Customer agrees that it shall be bound by all of the terms and conditions of the WSU/MOU and all obligations required thereunder, with the exception of the finding to allow for the implementation of the project assistance and technical services being provided by the Center.
- 4. The Customer further agrees that as it relates to the terms and conditions of the WSU/MOU, that it shall be bound by all of the terms and conditions of the Grant which are imposed upon the Foundation by the Ruth Mott Foundation pursuant to their approval letter dated November 6, 2015, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit B.

- 5. The Customer acknowledges that the Foundation's funding obligation hereunder is limited by the terms and conditions of the Grant, and that the Grant does not provide for all of the funds which may be necessary for any additional products and/or services from the Center.
- 6. The Customer agrees that the Foundation has no obligation to provide any and all additional finding, including but not limited to personnel, infrastructure, facilities, location, supplies and all other equipment/resources, beyond what is authorized and/or intended by the language and purpose of the Grant.
- 7. The Customer acknowledges and understands that the terms and conditions of the Grant only provide for certain resources to assist in funding the Project for a limited period of time, and that the duration of the Foundation's obligation is limited to a maximum of three (3) years, subject to the potential for prior termination in accordance with the language of both the WSU/MOU and the Grant.
- 8. The Customer agrees that it shall obtain all governmental and administrative approvals, including but not limited to any budget amendments, for the acquisition and implementation of the project assistance and technical services being provided by the Center, pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU, the WSU/MOU, and the Grant.
- 9. The Customer agrees that it shall cooperate with the Foundation to provide all necessary information to comply with the reporting requirements as contained within the Grant.
- 10. The Customer shall provide in advance to the Foundation all applicable quotations and invoices for approval and payment as determined by the Executive Director of the Foundation to be appropriate under the terms and conditions of the Grant.
- 11. The Customer shall fully indemnify and hold harmless the Foundation from any and all claims, suits, damages, obligations, costs, interest, fees, attorney fees, or expense of any kind which may be related either directly or indirectly to the project assistance and technical services being furnished by the Center (excluding only the funding commitment pursuant to the terms and conditions of both the Grant and the MOU).
- 12. The Customer shall also defend the Foundation, at the Customer's sole expense, in any litigation, arbitration, or other alternative dispute resolution forum, subject to the exclusive right of the Foundation to select legal counsel of its own choosing.
- 13. The Parties agree that this agreement contains adequate and sufficient consideration to bind the Parties to the obligations contained within this MOU and the affiliated documents referenced herein.
- 14. The Parties further agree that each entity has participated in the drafting of this MO'J and that in the event of any ambiguity, neither shall be entitled to a more favorable interpretation of any such ambiguous terms or conditions.
- 15. This MOU may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which together may constitute the entire MOU, and is valid with facsimile or electronic signatures.

I am pleased to inform you the Ruth Mott Foundation has granted \$1,087,107 to the Flint Police Foundation for the period 1/1/2016 through 12/31/2018.

#### Use of Grant

City of Flint Fourth Quarter Budget Amendment

The City of Flint adopted a budget for fiscal year 2016 and is committed to ongoing review of revenues and expenditures. A fourth quarter budget amendment has been prepared to reflect the changes to be made by June 30, 2016 to the budget year ending June 30, 2016 (FY2016) in compliance with Michigan's Public Act of 1968, Uniform Budgeting and Accounting Act.

Attached is the City's Proposed FY2016 Fourth Quarter Budget Amendment for your review.

#### General Fund

The General Fund reflects a net increase of \$827,310. The District Court had a net change of \$521,915, which was a result of the court being budgeted for 12 months but was merged with the 67th District Court on January 2, 2016. There was also an increase in revenue (\$16,275) in the City Clerk's budget due mainly to the State's reimbursement for the March election. Customer Service Income Tax had an increase of \$110,000 in Enforcement Revenue. The Fire Department had an increase in revenue of \$170,360 which was from an increase from the State for fire protection and a decrease in Charges for Services Rendered. Other adjustments that were made with no impact to fund balance occurred in the Charter Review budget to move \$12,485 from Professional Services to Wages and Fringes to pay wages for the committee members for their attendance at meetings. The Purchasing budget had an increase of \$3,470 in Copying Fees. The Police budget had a net adjustment of zero. The Police budget adjustments resulted from a decrease in revenues of \$259,960 along with corresponding decrease in Wages & Fringes, Vehicles and Equipment, and Professional Services of \$259,960.

### **Major Streets**

The Major Street Fund has an increase in Wages & Fringes of \$74,682 with an offsetting

decrease in Professional Services, Rentals and Equipment of \$74,682, which results in no net impact.

### **Public Safety Fund**

The Public Safety Fund shows an increase in revenue to reflect the payment from the Local Community Stabilization Share (State of Michigan) of \$334,024 and an increase to Wages & Fringes for police of \$71,793. This resulted in a net change of \$262,231.

#### Police Fund

The Police Fund shows an increase in revenue to reflect the payment from the Local Community Stabilization Share (State of Michigan) of \$92,450.

#### Drug Forfeiture

The Drug Forfeiture Fund shows an increase in revenue to reflect an increase in Fines & Forfeitures of \$95,449.

#### **Building Inspection Fund**

The Building Inspection Fund shows an increase in revenue to reflect an increase in Business Licenses & Permits of \$1,277,704. (\$947,321 was received for the General Motors plant.)

#### Sewer and Water Funds

Budget amendments were performed decreasing the amount of billed revenue and increasing the amount of uncollectible accounts for both the Sewer and Water Funds after a preliminary injunction order was issued in August 2015. The Court later amended the preliminary injunction order allowing the City to collect on accounts set aside and anticipated to be uncollectible as a result of the original order. In addition, the administration of the State's water bill relief program has positively impacted the remaining outstanding account balances by paying off past due balances for many customers.

### Sewer Fund

The Sewer Fund shows an increase in revenue of \$3,553,080 to reflect an increase in Sewer Charges & Forfeited Discounts.

#### Water Fund

The Water Fund shows an increase in revenue of \$2,064,416 in Water Charges and a decrease in expenditures of \$1,964,445. The decrease in expenditures is due to the restructuring of the City's outstanding Drinking Water Revolving Loans which postponed bond payments until 2021.

Please find attached the Budget to Actual Revenue and Expenditure Report and Cash and Investment Summary for the period ending May 31, 2016 for your review and submission to the RTAB per Emergency Manager Order 20.

As a reminder, YTD Balance reflects actual activity recorded as of June 16, 2016 for the period ending May 31, 2016. Invoices and purchases incurred for the period ending May 31, 2016 but not entered as of June 16 will increase actual activity amounts recorded. Available Balance is the difference between total budgeted amounts and actual activity shown in the YTD Balance column. Similarly, % BDGT Used represents the percentage of budget represented by the YTD Balances. Eighty-three percent (91.67%) of the City's fiscal year is now complete.

In general, the City strives in its revenue collection efforts such that YTD activity is shown at a higher percentage than the percentage of the year that has passed. Similarly, the City would strive to monitor its cost activity such that the percentage of expenditures YTD are below 91.67%. Revenues in the City's various funds follow the income source. For instance, property tax revenue is levied July 1 each year and due and payable by September 15. For those funds that rely upon property tax revenue, the majority of income has been posted and appears in the YTD balances. State revenue sharing payments to the General Fund and Major and Local

Streets are posted on a bi-monthly and monthly basis, respectively, and lag based on the period distribution dates of the State. Other income, such as forfeitures, licenses and asset sales, is posted as the underlying event occurs.

A summary of major events by Fund is provided below:

WATER AND SEWER FUNDS – Billing activity was suspended during the month of April while the City prepared to issue Public Act 24 water relief credits to its customers for the period April 2014 through March 2015. Billing resumed during the month of May. Public Act 24 covers the billing period through April 2016 for water charges only. May 2016 residential water charges have been pledged by the State for participation in the flushing program. The water bill relief and flushing credit programs do not impact billed revenue but provide cash flow stabilization as collection activity continues to decline. The first payment of \$15 million in reimbursement for the \$29,020,837 distributed in credits for the period April 2014-March 2016 was received in June.

The City is currently developing a strategy for resuming collection efforts consistent with those required to meet the criteria outlined in the State's FY17 adopted budget which allows for continuation of the water bill relief credits up to \$12.75 million covering the period May 2016 through December 2016 or the date that Flint water is declared "safe", whichever occurs sooner.

Expenditure activity for ongoing operations of the water and sewer funds remains constant. Both budget and cash flow activity for the City's water and sewer funds are being monitored closely.

All other funds have no significant activity to note and continue to provide City services within budget as anticipated.
