B. Approval of Minutes

Motion by Mr. Schrier to approve the draft minutes of the RTAB's February 21, 2018 meeting as presented. Motion moved and seconded by Dr. Nesbary. The RTAB approved the minutes of the February 21, 2018 meeting as presented.

III. New Business

A. News and Updates

Chair Wrobel reported the Emergency Loan Board meeting has been scheduled for April 9, 2018. Mr. Lewis added the final interest rate is expected to be between 1.8 and 2.2%, but noted there is a clause that the State of Michigan can sell the loan at a different rate in the future.

B. Monthly Reports

i. Cash Flow Projections

Mr. Lewis reported approximately \$100 thousand in debt service tax collections but no general fund/operating taxes from the City. Communication with the city has indicated an incoming amount higher than projected as a result of reconciliations from previous years. Mr. Todd arrived at this time, 4:07p.m., and was present for the remainder of the meeting.

ii. Liabilities Report

Mr. Lewis reported slight increases in ORS in UIA liabilities. Chair Wrobel asked whether the two agencies have provided a final amount for payment. Mr. Lewis answered that he is communicating with both agencies and expects a final amount soon.

iii. Comparison of Budgeted Revenue and Expenditure to Actual

Mr. Lewis reported no major unexpected items. Operating taxes are expected to come in starting in March. Chair Wrobel asked about the \$200 in budgeted interest payments. Mr. Lewis identified it as belonging to the upcoming payments to ORS and UIA. These amounts will be higher than originally projected as a result of the ELB meeting date being later than originally expected.

Attached, please find the Muskegon Heights Public Schools 2017/18 Budget Amendment, 2018/19 Proposed Budget, current year Budget to Actual Revenue and Expenditure Report, Cash Flow Statement, and Liabilities Report for your review.

2017/18 Budget Amendment

On May 7th, 2018, the Muskegon Heights Board of Education approved the 2017/18 budget amendment included in this packet. Changes from the original budget include:

Revenue

- Tax receipts are projected to be higher than originally projected. This looks to be from prior year adjustments and other recalculations performed by the City of Muskegon Heights.
- Oversight fees will be slightly lower than projected due to a small decline in enrollment at Muskegon Heights Public School Academy.
- Transfer and other revenue will be higher than projected. The reasons for this include receipt of funds from Highland Park Public Schools for shared business services performed in 2017/18 and additional rental income from our partnership with Orchard View Adult Education.

Expenditures

- Legal and audit services will be higher than projected.
- Interest and fees expense will be lower than projected due to planned payment of ORS and UIA balances in May 2018.
- Building services will be greater than originally projected because of unexpected boiler maintenance, increased insurance costs, and natural

- gas expenses related to the colder weather. We will also be performing some other necessary repairs to the administration building before the end of the fiscal year.
- Emergency loan expenditures will be higher due to additional interest expense that the district will incur at the closing of the emergency loans in May 2018.

2018/19 Proposed Budget

On May 7th, 2018, the Muskegon Heights Board of Education approved the 2018/19 proposed budget included in this packet. Items to highlight include:

Revenue

- Taxes revenues will be lower than the amounts received in 2017/18. We do not expect the calculations performed by the City of Muskegon Heights to carry over to 2018/19.
- Transfers and other revenue will be lower as we do not expect any shared business services in 2018/19.

Expenditures

- Executive Administration costs are projected to slightly increase due to a
 1% increase charged by our staffing firm.
- Interest and fees expense is projected to be significantly less when compared to 2017/18. This is due to the refinancing of the district's ORS and UIA balances.
- Emergency Loan expenditures will increase due to the new emergency loans used to eliminate the district's ORS and UIA obligations.

Budget to Actual Revenue and Expenditure Report

Attached you will find the budget to actual reports as of May 4th, 2018.

The district has received all of its revenue from the City of Muskegon Heights for 2017/18 and we are now awaiting our delinquent tax revenues from the County of Muskegon. We are expecting these funds sometime in late May or early June. As mentioned in the previous sections of this report, tax revenue is projected to be higher than originally planned for 2017/18.

Expenditures for building services will be higher than projected in 2017/18. The budgeted amount has been increased in the district's 2017/18 budget amendment.

Cash Flow Statement

The cash flow of the district continues to remain stable. We now know the cash requirements necessary to satisfy our outstanding ORS and UIA obligations as the district will close on its restructured and new emergency loans May 23, 2018.

This is a huge step in restoring the financial stability of the district.

Liabilities Report

The district will be restructuring its ORS and UIA liabilities on May 23, 2018 as mentioned in the previous section. Reducing the interest associated with these balances will greatly benefit the district going forward.
