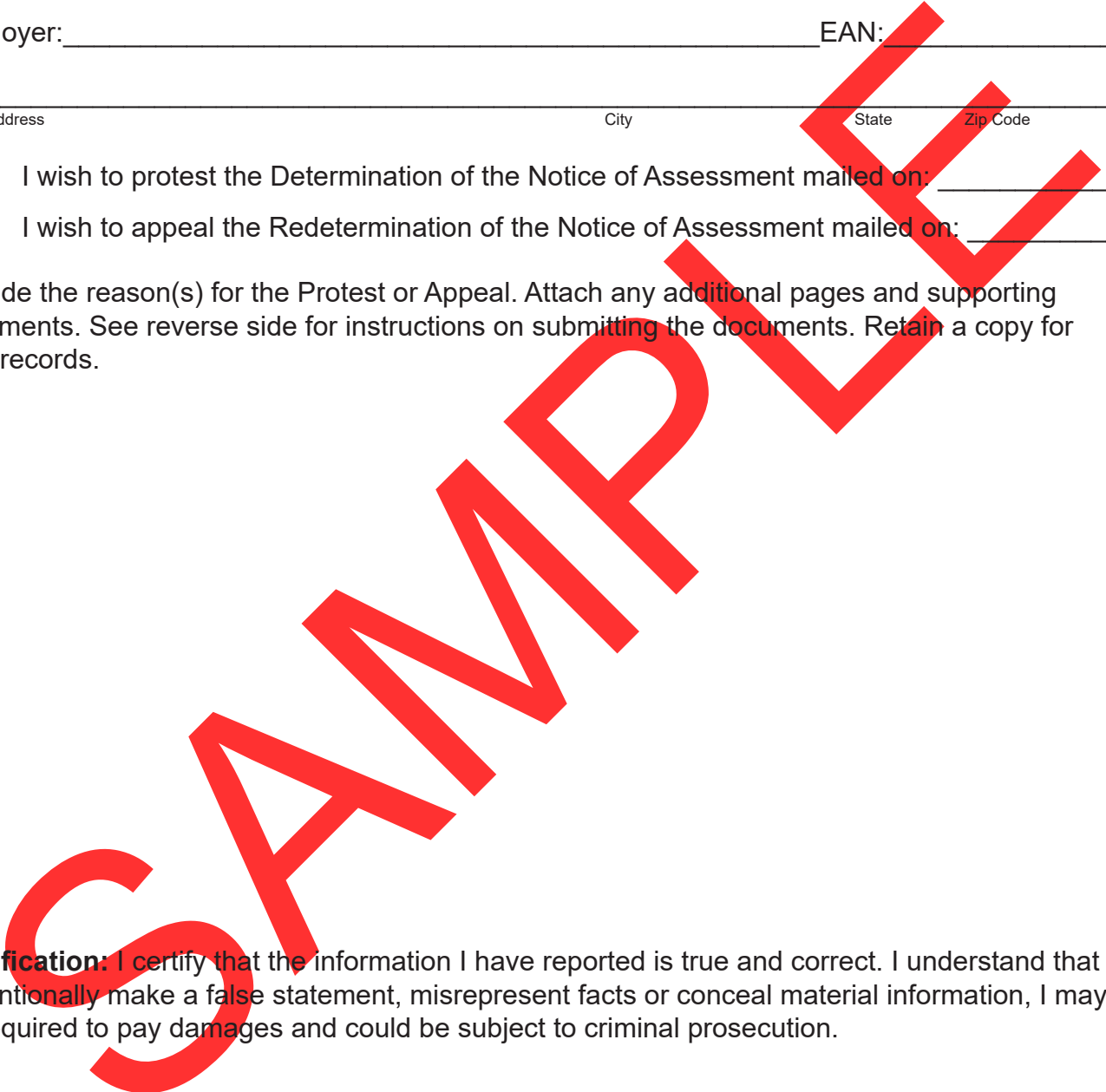

Protest Rights

If you disagree with this determination you have the right to protest requesting a redetermination. If your protest is filed after the deadline, you must include the reason your protest is late in your statement. You can also attach copies of any documents that support your protest.

You can submit your protest online at www.michigan.gov/uia sign into MIlogin to access your MiWAM account and upload documents. If you wish to protest in writing, complete Form UIA 1471-T, *Protest of a Determination*. This form is located on the UI website under the Forms link. Include your name and employer account number (EAN) on documents submitted with your protest. Mail the completed Form UIA 1471-T and any supporting documents to Unemployment Insurance, P.O. Box 8068, Royal Oak, MI 48068-8068 or by fax to 517-635-0014. Your protest must be signed.

Your protest must be received no later than [date] or this determination becomes final.

Appeal Rights

If you disagree with this redetermination you have the right to an appeal requesting a hearing before an administrative law judge. If your appeal is filed after the deadline, you must include the reason your appeal is late in your statement. You can also attach copies of any documents that support your appeal.

You can submit your appeal online at www.michigan.gov/uia sign into MIlogin to access your MiWAM account and upload documents. If you wish to appeal in writing, complete Form UIA 1471-T, *Appeal of a Redetermination*. This form is located on the UI website under the Forms link. Include your name and employer account number (EAN) on documents submitted with your appeal. Mail the completed Form UIA 1471-T and any supporting documents to Unemployment Insurance, P.O. Box 8068, Royal Oak, MI 48068-8068 or by fax to 517-635-0014. Your appeal must be signed.

Your appeal must be received no later than [date] or this redetermination becomes final.
