**Background:** Since 2005, the United States Department of Labor (USDOL) and participating state Unemployment Insurance Agencies (UIAs) have been addressing individual reemployment needs of the Unemployment Insurance (UI) claimants to prevent and detect improper UI payments. This program has replaced the Mandatory Profiling program. The UIA submitted a proposal to the USDOL developed by the UIA and the Workforce Development Agency (WDA) to continue the RESEA program.

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**Policy:** This policy change deobligates \$30,000 from GST Michigan Works! and provides an additional \$30,000 to UPWARD Talent Council.
